## August in Antarctica

is the name of an event in which SAG played a role on August 10th, 2013. The community activity celebrated the 55th anniversary of Richard Byrd library (RBL)

where we meet now, and where we met when SAG began almost 44 years ago. Namesake Richard Byrd (1880-1957) was an aviator and explorer of both the north and south poles as well as earning the rank of Rear Admiral in the US Navy. Here's how the celebration came about, and what transpired:

SAG president Stephanie Bianco and the presidents of seven other community organizations were contacted by The Friends of RBL president, Chris Peterson, and all met with Chris, RBL manager Sandy Freund, and RBL Intern Carol Quinn in several planning sessions to create and coordinate the celebration's details, which was entirely funded by the Friends of Richard Byrd Library's recent book sale.

Stephanie and Shirley Edwards came up with two ideas for SAG: two large cut out boards to be painted with penguins (RBL's mascot) for the purpose of visitors putting their heads through for fun photo souvenirs, and penguin face painting. (photo) Lydia Jehorek, Shirley, Kathy and Stephanie all painted pretty penguins on about 75 arms, hands and faces the day of the event. Barb Aigen supplied numerous adorable hand crafted penguin rocks, a rock plane representing Richard Byrd's actual plane Josephine Ford, and a painted icy Antarctican turf under them.

Additionally Lydia thought of a very popular activity to add to SAG's contribution: white balloons placed on orange plate "feet" on which people could draw magic marker penguin faces or bodies. About three hundred new balloon penguins left the building! Shirley made a trifold display board to advertise SAG to the visitors, and Teresa Brunson created and had printed our new SAG brochures. Lots of them were distributed to interested visitors to advertise our presence in the community. Elaine Sevy, Mary Rose Janya and another lady also graciously supported our presence.



Other activities included penguin egg pass, artificial snow for children to mold, a "blubber" exhibit to demonstrate how blubber keeps penguins warm, actual clothing explorers might wear that one could try on, snow cones, and creating a flag.



The new yellow nylon flag sporting lots of fingerprint animals imprinted by visitors on August 10th will actually be flown at the penguin colony in Antarctica! Jean Pennycook/Penguin Science will transport it to the penguin colony on October 27th and will eventually be seen on the Penguin Cam at PenguinScience.com. And the post cards created by visitors will be postmarked and mailed to their creators from Antarctica too.

- Artwork Delivery and 'Hanging Day': Wednesday, October 30, 2013 from 4 to 6 PM.
- Opening Art Reception, Award Presentation & Concert: Friday, November 15, 2013 7 to 9 PM.
- Pickup after the November / December Celebrate The Season Of Art! Show: Thursday, January 2 from 4 to 6 PM.

### Advantages, Eligibility & Entry Guidelines:

• Sherwood Center: This exciting art venue will be open to the Fairfax community 7 days a week with very nice traffic.

- There will be no registration or hanging fees.
- Art Theme: We are searching for VERY BIG, COLORFUL, BOLD & BRIGHT ARTWORK!!!
- Art Submission Guidelines: We will hang about 70 pieces of original artwork in this show. You are invited to share up to 3 art submissions. Artwork must be at least 16" x 20" or larger. All artwork submissions will need to have proper hanging wires on the back. Only art that will safely hang on a wall with wires will be acceptable. We will create the Art Title & Price Cards that will need to be attached to the bottom of each artwork frame as they cannot be attached to the Sherwood Center walls.
- Original Artwork: As approved for the Sherwood Center, we will accept all original artwork, inclusive of all original limited edition signed and numbered artwork. Original artwork may be a single limited edition painting, drawing, lithograph, serigraph, photograph or sculpture to hang on a wall. Original limited edition fine art that is signed and numbered, will be acceptable as original art. We will not accept any unlimited edition lithography, serigraphy or photography. There is no age limit for artists.
- Art Sales: The sales and commissions will be handled by the City Of Fairfax. They will take a 30% sales commission. If any of your artwork is sold, you will need to be ready to quickly replace that artwork with another piece of artwork within 24 to 48 hours. "All artwork submissions must be available for sale." Artwork must be available to hang during the entire duration of this show. You will be responsible to pay any applicable taxes on art sales.
- City Of Fairfax Agreement: All artists will be required to sign a City Of Fairfax Art Agreement when dropping off artwork.
- Sherwood Gallery Guidelines: To meet the requirements of the City Manager, City Council and everyone involved, Joanna Ormesher will act as our final authority for all artwork proposed for hanging in the Sherwood Center, while she will have veto power to reject anything she does not deem appropriate.
- Shared Responsibilities: The City of Fairfax will use reasonable care in handling and displaying artwork. They will not be responsible for any loss, theft or damage to artwork on display for this art show.
