Receiving a degree in Visual Communications from the Art Institute of Pittsburgh in 1980, I've been self employed as a graphic artist / designer / photographer since 1990. And more recently, glass artist.

Although my love for glass began long ago, creating with glass started in 2008 with classes in mosaics. Kilnforming, casting, flameworking and glassblowing followed. As a resident artist at the Workhouse Arts Center in

Lorton, Virginia, I design and create functional. decorative and sculptural art in

Glasshouse Studio 712. Artworks include servingware, lighting, art tables, wall installations and commission work. I teach classes, workshops and summer camp to all ages. Also share Studio 25, a gallery setting of four artists at LibertyTown Arts Workshop in Fredericksburg, Virginia.

Curiosity feeds my experimentation. An exploration into recycled or 'trash' glass evolved into a recent featured exhibition at the Glasshouse, Refuse: One man's trash Using glass from broken tabletops; wine and beer bottles; scrap furnace

The group will begin meeting in February on Friday evening in the Richard Byrd Library meeting room. Permission has been given the group to maintain a permanent gallery in the meeting room of the library which has a wall specially designed to facilitate the hanging of

The purpose of the guild is to provide outlets for local artists to meet and work together to encourage recognition and provide encouragement to new and established artists in all media.

Applications blanks will be mailed out in the near future and further information can be secured by calling Mrs. Frost at 451-3113. Membership is not restricted to residents of the Springfield community.

The Arts Guild is an outgrowth of the Olde Keene Mill Shopping Center Art Show where many of the artists expressed an interest in the formation of such a group. The group will maintain a list of local artists, art teachers and art shows. Speakers, demonstrations critiques, models, etc. will be part of the regular monthly meetings. Membership is open to adults, students and art families. Discounts for art supplies will be sought.

Descriptions of positions:

Board Members:

President: Make sure the organization operates within the bylaws (which are printed at the end of the current membership list of addresses and phone numbers.) Usually presides over monthly board meetings, and monthly All Membership meetings. The Membership currently meets on the second Wednesday of each month, and the Board meets the following Monday evening, September through June. Oversees the activities of the membership to promote the vision of the Guild. Is a co-signer on the SAG bank account.

Vice President: Selects and schedules the speakers and judges who appear at the monthly All Membership meetings. Supports the President if he or she must be absent from any above duty.

Treasurer: Files the Annual Corporate Report; receives and disburses the funds for the agreed upon actions within the Guild, and keeps an accurate written, account of these activities. Account will be updated monthly and results briefly reported at each Board and All Member meeting. Is the liaison with the bank in which SAG funds are held (currently Bank of America; one office is in the parking lot of Springfield Mall) and with our SAG attorney (currently Brian Taylor Goldstein) for the Corporate Paperwork. Disburses a check to the paid speaker or judge each month.

Secretary: Attends Board Meetings regularly and makes a written account of the Board's discussions and decisions. Circulates an emailed account soon after the Board meeting to all the board members and makes any reasonable correction a board member requests by return email. The final version of the monthly minutes is sent to the webmaster by email. May send an occasional card or letter to a member as directed by the Board.

At Large Board Members: Try to represent SAG's interests in the community as appropriate and bring to the board meetings suggestions for growing and improving SAG. Attends as many board meetings as possible, keeping in mind that for the board to vote, a quorum must be present to vote.

*****Non Board Volunteer Positions:******

Webmaster: This is an ongoing responsibility to keep and update our presence online. The webpage is already established, so it is only necessary to maintain or improve what we already have.

Editor: A vitally important part of our online presence, information distribution and membership support is our monthly newsletter. It has already been created, so the newsletter position required a person to create each new issue on the established format; he or she solicits, receives, and edits cogent material from the membership ongoing.

Librarian: Our current librarian has reinvented the process to access SAG's valuable collection of DVDs to enhance SAG members' skills in various artistic endeavors. The explanation is on the website. The Librarian evaluates member DVD requests and after approval by the SAG Board, purchases new DVD selections with SAG funds.

Newsletter contributors: Write once or often about art related or SAG events. Send photos with information about their contents. Email your contributions to Editor Reggie Garrett, who has the final say on what to include and when. Be sure to put "SAG" on the subject line of the email you send.

Publicity: Submits and may create flyers or other material about SAG and/or its shows and activities as needed to local newspapers, or other places as necessary. This is probably a fairly occasional, intermittent activity.

Mailbox: SAG has a mailbox at the Post Office on Brookfield Plaza on Backlick Road in Springfield. If requested, email and/or cellphone notifications can be easily arranged for free so that the volunteer knows when to go to the box. The mail is then delivered to someone on the board; exactly how can be worked out between the volunteer and the board for everyone's convenience. A trip every other week should be enough. This is a very easy, low time commitment job, though does require a <u>reliable</u> person.

Membership: This person keeps a written record of each SAG member's name, Mailing address, phone number, email address, and types of their artwork. Volunteer will update, have printed (with SAG funds) and distribute the Membership Directory annually. It is labor intensive in the fall of the year. Lydia currently holds this position, but wants to give up either Membership or Treasurer, so please volunteer if this could work for you. Lydia will show you how to do the specifics.

Show Chairs: Shows offer our membership wide exposure and opportunity to grow their skills. So show chairs are very valuable. While our three established venues are currently chaired, there is always the opportunity to create a new show, big or small. Organizational talents will be needed, and chairs can and should elicit help from the membership! Coaching is available!

Hospitality: Arranges for the refreshments for SAG monthly meetings, organizes and plans extra small and the SAG Holiday party.

Historian: Archives a print copy of each Newsletter; perhaps other duties.
