#### Carolyn Grossé Gawarecki, NWS, WHS



We are delighted that Carolyn has agreed to critique participating SAG member "works in progress" at our January meeting. Carolyn is an accomplished painter who holds more than 100 awards locally and nationally, and has paintings in numerous collections.

She has signature memberships in the National Watercolor Society, Knickerbocker Artists, Virginia Watercolor Society, Southern Watercolor Society, Washington Water Color Association, Baltimore Watercolor Society, Watercolor USA Honor Society, The Art League, and The Potomac Valley Watercolorists.

Carolyn is the founder and first president of the Potomac Valley

Watercolorists art society. She has participated in the U.S. International Arts in the Embassies Program, received a grant

to paint in Dinan, Fr., June 1997, and had a painting selected for exhibition by Douglass College for their first Artist Series.

Carolyn has taught and lectured art at the Art League School, Alexandria, and Falls Church City, VA, in other venues within the U.S. internationally. She has also served as the judge for watercolor shows in Florida and Delaware. She is a member of the Springfield Art Guild.

## Excerpt from her online Artist's Statement:

"Watercolor fascinates me with its challenge of maintaining a balance between control and spontaneity. I always have a plan, but I try to allow for the unexpected nuances that appear when paint and water mingle. ... Although my works are rendered in a realistic manner, they are first designed in the abstract. Rich colors and strong value are hallmarks of my watercolors. Teaching and sharing my knowledge with others has been a driving force in my career as a professional."

Acceptance: At least one artwork per member will be accepted (if entered on or before Jan 4th); all artwork will be accepted and hung as space allows; assume all of your entries will be hung unless you hear from us prior to the delivery date.

**Delivery:** All accepted artwork must be delivered, ready to be hung (framed and wired), to the Franconia Government Center on Saturday, Jan 17 between 10:00 and 10:30am; all entrants are expected to assist with hanging (approx 10:30 until noon); 3D artist are expected to tag each accepted artwork with the label information listed above and arrange their artwork in the show case provided, which limits each artwork to 12" (H) by 12" (W) by 8" (D).

Pick Up: All entrants are expected to fetch their artwork on February 21 between 10:00 and 10:30am.

## The Artist this month is Maria Bennett Hock


Maria Bennett Hock uses figures and portraits to paint concept pieces that tell a story. A cursory glance will let you see the picture, but not the story; these pieces are to be read. She uses the facial features in her paintings to capture attention and allow the viewer to deduce the story behind the painting.



Maria enjoys working on multiple projects at a time. Currently, her main focus is on a series of paintings depicting scenes from military life. As a "military brat" and military spouse, she hopes to share her unusual experiences. This is one of a number of series Maria has explored and she continues to explore themes that show strong, confident women.

Maria feels very fortunate to have been able to show her work at numerous galleries to include shows in Dupont Circle,

Washington DC, Alexandria, Virginia, and Solomon's Island, Maryland, Cincinnati, Ohio, Sedona, Arizona, Costa Mesa, California, and Charleston, South Carolina.



Maria's camera is always at the ready so she doesn't miss any opportunity of capturing a wonderful moment she will later paint. She also has a home studio/gallery where she enjoys working from life or setting up a photo shoot for source material.

She is a copyist at the National Gallery of Art in Washington DC. She has found the experience as a copyist to be enormously rewarding. As a copyist she begins by studying the piece to be copied, the artist and does research on the palette used. Visiting the gallery beforehand lets her take notes, study



brush strokes and play with color. The gallery provides an easel and a locker to store supplies. Matching colors and brush strokes she imagines what the master artist must have felt when the composition first came together. It is a magical, albeit challenging, experience.

Along with commissions and gallery exhibits, Maria is a member of the Portrait Society of America, Oil Painters of America, Springfield Art Guild, and the Torpedo Factory Art Center. She is an active blogger where she showcases her paintings and work in progress, explaining her process and the stories her paintings tell.

## Call for Entry: Visions of Courage, Impressions of Service at the Workhouse Arts Center, Deadline Feb 9, 2015

The Workhouse Arts Center accepts entries for its upcoming art exhibition *Visions of Courage, Impressions* of *Service.* 

The exhibition will express, through art, the values of the first responders and interpretations of police, fire and first responders from around the world. The exhibit may honor and/or represent perceptions of courage and service. Visitors will experience artwork by first responders and by individuals reacting to their experiences with, or feelings towards, first responders.

The World Police and Fire Games is a spectacular biennial event celebrating the athletic ability, honor, courage and camaraderie of first responders. 12,000 first responders from 70 countries will compete in Fairfax County, VA. Past hosts include Indianapolis, Barcelona, Melbourne, Vancouver, New York and Belfast.

#### Helen Frederick

Helen C. Frederick is an American artist known mainly for printed media and large scale works created by hand papermaking and the use of language. She is recognized as a distinguished curator, educator, coordinator of international projects, and as founder of Pyramid Atlantic, A Center for Printmaking, Hand Papermaking, the Art of the Book, and Digital Media in Silver Spring, MD. As an advocate for, and an active participant in, the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area arts scene for the last 30 years, she has played a role in the revitalization of the Silver Spring, MD arts corridor, served on the directorial boards of alternative art spaces in the District of Columbia, various local and national boards and national peer-review panels. She has exhibited, curated exhibitions, and fulfilled speaking engagements around the world, always emphasizing collaboration across disciplines. Her recent interests lie in understanding how assimilated technologies grow from indigenous cultures and are a primary trajectory of this century. She is a Professor of Art, School of Art and Design, George Mason University, Fairfax, VA and on the Board of Directors for the College Arts Association (CAA).

Eligibility: Open to all artists around the world. All media may be entered; however entries are limited to only wall hanging (or 2D) art.

Juror Process: Juror will select from digital images of artwork and accompanying text. If selected, no substitutions are allowed. Artists may submit up to 3 entries with a minimum of 2 entries. If art is 3 dimensional and a wall hanging, an alternative image angle may be submitted.

Application Fee: \$30 (USA). Fee is non-refundable and processed through PayPal when applying.

Application Requirements: Applications are submitted online via Juried Art Service, at

www.juriedartservices.com. A minimum of 2 artworks and a maximum of 3 artworks may be submitted.

Please submit the following:

- 1. Name and title of each artwork
- 2. Type of media used to create each artwork
- 3. Size of the artwork
- 4. Insurance value / retail price
- 5. A brief artist statement of no more than 150 words describing your work(s) (in English)

6. Art is to be uploaded with professional quality JPG images smaller than 15mb with a minimum resolution of 150dpi and maximum resolution of 300dpi

Sales, Insurance and Copyright: The Workhouse Arts Center agrees to keep and display accepted art and, if unsold upon the completion of the exhibit, return work if provided with pre-paid shipping in the same condition as it was received. The Workhouse will not insure artwork in transit; however will insure artwork at 60% of the value once in the possession of the Workhouse. The Workhouse will conduct sales and retain a 40% commission. Art does not have to be for sale. All sales support the Workhouse Arts Foundation, a non-profit

organization. Artist provided images of accepted artwork, or Workhouse generated images, may be used for printed, digital, or film marketing at no cost to the Workhouse or money owed the Artist.

**Shipping and Return:** Artists are responsible for shipping artwork to and from the Workhouse Arts Center and insuring artwork while in transit. Artworks may be professionally shipped or hand delivered by the Artist. All shipped work must be shipped in a reusable container and packing to be re-shipped back to the artists. Artist must provide a pre-paid return shipping label or artwork will not be returned. Accepted work should be shipped to:
