### The Artist this month is **Robert J. Roulston**



Robert Roulston is a mostly self-taught artist residing in Springfield, Virginia. For the past 14 years he has been a member of the U.S. Foreign Service. His previous occupations as an airline pilot and Air Force officer mean that Rob has lived and traveled all over the world.



Rob's favorite painting medium is acrylics. He has shown his work at the Plum Center for Lifelong Learning and won second place at the 2011

Springfield Art Guild's Fall Art Expo. More recently, his work was on display at the Vienna Arts Society's 2014 Treasury of Art show and at the Franconia Government Center.

When composing a new painting, Rob prefers subjects that are deeply introspective, with a sense of solitude, simplicity, and sublime beauty. His paintings strive to capture the moments of clarity and consciousness in one's life; the fleeting glance



out a window, an unexpected view during a walk, or any number of moments when a dramatic scene unfurls itself. Those are the times that bring pause, thoughtfulness and, hopefully, appreciation for life's gifts. Rob revels in the process of translating those experiences to canvas, where they can be re-lived many times over.

## Art "Happenings" at the Workhouse

Event Date: Saturday, March 7, 2015 to Sunday, April 12, 2015 Venue: Lorton Workhouse, building W-16 - McGuireWoods Gallery "The Places We Have Been: Exploring the Internal and External Travels of Veterans and Service Members" Public Opening Reception: Friday, March 13, 7-9pm

"I believe we internalize landscapes," an idea voiced by Vietnam veteran and Pulitzer Prize winning poet Yusef Komunyaakaa in a writing workshop offered last spring at the USO Warrior and Family Center at Fort Belvoir. This ideaof being the places we have been--acknowledges the impact military tours of duty have on identity, and the feeling of displacement that can come at the end of active military service. It is the impetus of the exhibition, which explores the internal and external landscapes traveled by veterans and Service members of the National Capital Region.

In **The Places We Have Been** artist Service members and veterans invite you to examine and explore their literal and figurative interpretations of relationships to internal and external landscapes--their places of origin, the ways they have interacted with landscapes during tours of duty, and even the consideration of the body as a landscape. In additional to 2 dimensional work, the exhibition will include short films made by veterans during a week-long workshop at the USO Warrior and Family Center at Fort Belvoir in collaboration with visiting poet Jivepoetic and filmmaker Felicia Barr.

#### Music, Word and Exhibition Reception: March 13, 7-9pm

Workhouse Arts Center, McGuireWoods Gallery

All are welcome to celebrate the exhibition openings and a collaborative performance by veterans, Service members, and Grammy-nominated hip-hop artist, Christylez Bacon, and six-string electric cellist, Wytold. The event is the culminating performance of a Music & Writing workshop offered at the USO Warrior and Family Center at Fort Belvoir. In that workshop, local Service Members will collaborate with internationally touring poet Mahogany L. Browne as well as Christylez Bacon and Wytold to compose original songs that speak to the theme of origins and place. The event will also feature remarks by Colonel Gadson (USA, Ret.), and the launch of the Workhouse Military and the Arts Initiative. This event is sponsored by the USO of Metropolitan Washington-Baltimore.

#### Combat Paper One Night Exhibit: April 3, 7-9pm

Join artist Service members and veterans as they add to the exhibit "The Places We Have Been: Exploring the Internal and External Travels of Veterans and Service Members", for one night only, with an exhibit of Combat Paper art. The exhibit will be a culmination of a week-long workshop at the USO Warrior and Family Center at Fort Belvoir with Warrior Writers and Combat Paper, NJ. Be inspired by a series of performances by veterans and Service members including poetry and song. This event is sponsored by the USO of Metropolitan Washington-Baltimore.
