Guest Speaker Sandy Olszowy

She currently spends way too much time working for a government contractor, and dreaming of days when there will be more time and energy for creative endeavors.

before becoming full-time stay at home mom for many years. Creating works of art took a back seat for a long time. But the kids had the BEST projects, for they had real art supplies to use!



It was in the college days Sandy discovered a love of watercolor. Much much later, it is still her primary medium, although these days horizons are broadening into other areas. One is a passion for alcohol inks, a love for the brilliance of the colors, the transparency of the medium and its unpredictability. It seems like play.

"We started out by deconstructing Sharpie markers to make home-made alcohol inks. My niece was living with me at the time, and she was really good at figuring out how to take apart the markers so we could soak the centers in alcohol. I've progressed from there! There are people doing marvelous

wondrous things in this new and very challenging medium, and while I don't always love the results of my efforts, I'm finding that it's great fun getting there."



WORKING WITH PHOTOS

Two items on working with photos:

1. Helen Van Wyk was a popular oil painting instructor with her own show on PBS called "Welcome to My Studio". She did beautiful portraits in oil, and her book "Portraits in Oil the Van Wyk Way" is a great resource for portrait painters. She died in 1994 but her show lives on on YouTube. In the book I found the following suggestion about how to credit a reference photo used to make a painting but which was not your own photo.

"There are times when you must use a commercial photograph, such as the obvious one of painting a portrait posthumously. When using such a photograph, you should credit the photographer, if you know his name. This information can appear along with your signature on the front of the painting and also on the back of the canvas, painted lightly with a bristle brush that's been slightly wetted with a color. If you don't know the photographer's name, however, merely indicate that you did copy from a photograph with the words "from photo" written under your signatiure and, again, on the rear of the canvas. When you work from photographs that you take yourself, you need not cite any information about using photography as your source of reference. Your photographs are merely your means to an end."

I don't know this to be the final word on crediting photos not your own, but it apparently was her practice...

2. Still on the subject of photos,

Mitchell Albala has a wonderful piece on his blog (<u>http://blog.mitchalbala.com</u>/using-photographs-like-an-artist/) on best practices. Albala is the author of the very useful book Landscape Painting: Essential Concepts and Techniques for Plein Air and Studio Practice (Watson-Guptill, 2009). (In general, his blog is extensive and really outstanding.) Albala says (abbreviated extracts):

Be an interpreter, not a copyist.

If all we do is replicate the photo, then why do the painting at all?

[In speaking of the work of artist Terry Furchgott...] Only in general subject does the final painting resemble the photo. Most of all, her subjective and vibrant interpretation of color is testament to the fact that the artist is a far more intentional colorist that the camera will ever be.

Make the composition your own.

A camera defines a composition the moment the shutter is pressed. Don't be too quick to accept this as the "final" composition. Tip: When photographing subjects of interest, don't attempt to compose the perfect picture in the camera.

Don't follow photographic color.

If one is simply copying the color, then one is not translating, but engaged in an uncreative color matching exercise. A photograph may be used for suggesting generalized color direction, but it should not be used for matching colors, hue-for-hue...

Don't trust photographic values

The most misleading type of information provided by the photograph is its value relationships. All too often, the camera creates too much contrast between the lights and shadows, especially in bright light. It underexposes the darks (turning them to black) and overexposes the lights (making them overly light or white)...

Manage detail and edges

Keep it simple. When it comes to detail the painter must strike a delicate balance. The photo is ideally suited to give us information about detail, but it can also trick us into capture detail in excess. The artist must always pay attention to the big shapes that drive the composition, and detail must always remain subordinate to those shapes. **Tip:** Artists control attention and interest in their artwork by not giving equal weight to all detail. Assigning varying degrees of hardness and softness to edges creates a form of spatial mapping that helps support the illusion of space.

Beware of ambiguous or awkward passages

We sometimes find ambiguous or awkward passages in our subjects that we think are interesting...

...when brought into our artwork they can look ambiguous or poorly drawn.

Let go of the photo

At a certain point, the photograph needs to be put aside. As a piece develops it takes on a life of its own and becomes independent of the source from which it derives. If you are constantly looking at the photo, you will be pulled in its direction and begin to make less creative choices.

Consider the source

One of the biggest mistakes an artist can make is to start with a poor reference. If you are going to rely on the photo for detail, drawing, or composition, then those things must be working well in the photo.

Again, visit his blog... it's very instructive.

August 4 - Registration & payment due.

This show is open to SAG MEMBERS ONLY. Members may enter up to 3 pieces. Fee: \$10 each or 3 for \$25. Make sure your membership is up to date. Those who join SAG after June 2017 for the coming year may participate, but will pay a non-member fee of \$15 per piece of art.

Monday, August 21 - Receiving 12:00-1:00 Judging 1:00 pm-2:00; Show installation from 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm. Pick up unselected art from 2:00 pm - 3:00 pm

Sunday, August 27 - Reception and Awards, 1:00 - 3:00 pm

Monday, October 23 – show take down and pick up art **10:45 to noon**. Artists must pick up on this date or arrange pickup by a friend. There is no storage space.

Submission Criteria

- Artwork must focus on flora, fauna, or local (DC, MD, VA) landscapes.
- ✓ Artwork must be for sale and if selected stay on exhibition from August 22 to October 22, 2017 in Green Spring Gardens Park
- ✓ SAG members may submit up to 3 pieces of artwork no larger than 40" x 40" (including frame)
- Only hand painted, hand drawn or other "original" 2-D art, created in the last 2 years, will be considered. Traditional photographs and digitally enhanced photographs are welcome. Drafts, photocopies, offset prints, lithographs or copies of already published art will not be permitted.
- ✓ All artwork must be for sale and suitable framed. Entries must be ready to hang with hooks and wire and be protected by glass or plexi-glass when necessary.
- ✓ Saw tooth hangers, clips, wet canvases, soiled or poorly matted works will not be accepted, nor will artwork previously shown at a SAG sponsored Green Spring Gardens show. Exposed nails must be covered by a backing and or tape.
- Artists making sales shall submit a 20% commission to Green Spring Gardens Park at the close of the show and are responsible for Virginia sales tax which Green Spring Gardens Park will collect. All sales will be made through Green Spring Gardens Park. Artists will be provided sales details when work is accepted for the show.
- ✓ All artists shall be solely and exclusively responsible to insure properly and adequately their work and property. By submitting this application, the artist agrees to fully and finally release the Springfield Art Guild, its directors, officers, employees or volunteers and employees of Green Springs involved with the exhibit of any and all responsibility for any damage or loss to any artwork during the time of the exhibition, its set up and take down. Be aware that insurance policies in effect will not provide coverage for damage or loss due to fire, theft or burglary and vandalism. The artist agrees to maintain their own insurance if they so choose. The artist agrees to assume all risk of damage to or loss of his/her own art from whatever cause. The transport, installation and removal of the artworks are not covered by insurance.

Using Perspective to Draw a Tea Cup by Liz Steel

<u>Liz Steel</u> is a Sydney based artist and architect. She is the author of an excellent webpage packed with all kinds a great art tips. Check out her newsletter to keep up-to-date on her postings.

Steel's sketches on how to use perspective when you are drawing round or cylinder shapes is a great follow-up to our February meeting. Go to her August 19, 2014 posting, <u>"How to Draw a Teacup"</u> to get this free tutorial <u>download</u> with step-by-step examples and notes.

Steel also shares lots of great advice on journaling on her website. Her <u>sketching tools</u> post (2/4/16) shows the tools Steel uses for her journaling.

Last month (March 2017), Steel and <u>Marc Taro</u> <u>Holmes</u> (Citizen Sketcher website) hosted a sketching challenge to <u>draw 100 people in 5 days</u>. They did 100 quick draw figures and faces sketching. Steel's website provides great insights through her notes on her quick sketches.

I keep telling myself I will carry a sketchbook more often, but find I usually only sketch people when I'm at the airport waiting for a flight. A lightbulb went on the other day when I saw an interesting gentleman on a TV documentary and thought I'd like to draw him. I realized if I pause my TV when I see people I want to draw people I have hundreds of figures and faces at my disposal for quick sketches.

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
SAG is Missing DVDs

Nature Journaling Mondays, 3-5:00 p.m at Lake Accotink Park.

Let's get outside and do some Nature Journaling. Join us also if you'd like to do some plein air painting/and or photography.

I'm a Nature Journaling enthusiast but not an expert or teacher. I'm just an enthusiastic volunteer, and these activities are free to the public.

As artists, Nature Journaling is an excellent way to improve our observation skills. It's also a great way to become more comfortable painting and sketching in plein air (outside), and doing studies that inspire future paintings.

We will start each session at the park's marina and branch out to different locations from there.

Directions to Lake Accotink Park's marina area —

Take Springfield/644W exit from I-95, which puts you on Old Keene Mill Road.

At the 3rd stoplight, make a right on Hanover Road. Continue on Hanover Road through a residential section to Highland Ave where you make a left.

Stay on Highland Ave. a short distance, and make a slight right onto Accotink Park Road. An industrial area will be on your right. After a short distance, the park entrance is on the left (Accotink Park Rd continues here).

Drive to the end of Accotink Park Rd (past Park Office on the left at 7500 Accotink Park Road and the first large public parking lot by the dam) to the parking lot by the marina.

***Please Note that GPSs often send people to the wrong park entrance

Nature Journaling is a relaxing way to see and experience our local parks in a new way and can help us get "up close and personal" with plants and animals we might otherwise miss. It also offers an opportunity to explore what each season has to offer.

The Springfield Art Guild has partnered with the Friends of Lake Accotink Park and Friends of Accotink Creek to offer these kinds of visual arts activities in our community. We are fortunate to have such beautiful, natural areas set aside for our use and enjoyment.
