"The Eyes Have It" by William Schneider

<u>William Schneider</u> paints beautiful portraits and figures. He is another artist who is amazingly generous sharing painting tips on his blog. He works in oil and pastel, but his tips are useful for everyone. You can sign up for his <u>newsletter</u> on his webpage.

His most current blog posting, "The Eyes Have It" gives great tips for painting eyes, something many artists struggle with when trying to paint a portrait.



To see his step-by-step demo of painting eyes, go to Schneider's Blog where you can read even more of about his techniques. Here are some of the Schneider's suggestions from "The Eyes Have It":

- 1) The eyes are mainly in shadow. Back in art school, my life drawing teacher, Bill Parks, taught us that there are five shadows that define the human face (in normal light).
 - The shadow in the eye sockets
 - The shadow under the nose
 - The shadow of the upper lip
 - The shadow beneath the lower lip and
 - The shadow under the chin.
- 2) A second key principle is that *eyes are constantly in motion*. This means that they **MUST** be painted with soft edges or they won't look right...much softer than you think.
- 3) A third key is that even within the basic shadow of the eye socket, the eye has a series of lit and shadowed planes that need to be represented. If we look at the diagram of an eye in its socket in cross section (from the side) we see:
 - The shadow area under the eyebrow
 - The top of the upper lid catching light
 - The shadow under the upper lid (shading the top of the iris)
 - The highlight
 - The "spotlight" on the iris
 - The top plane of the lower lid catching light and
 - The shadow of the bottom plane of the lower lid.

On the StencilGirl website, you can enjoy one of Amy's video tutorials as she creates her art on panels with ghost prints and acrylic gels. In the video Amy is using stencils designed by Cecilia Swatton and



SAG Members Use Their Artistic Talent to Help the Library

The Richard Byrd Library was having a Book Sale. The Art Guild promised to "dress up" the library's big 10 by 6-foot window with all the details for the event—which was taking place in less than a week! The dynamic duo of Barb Aigen and Mary Rose Janya took up the challenge. Having never painted on glass before, Barb and Mary Rose thought this would be a good opportunity to learn from the experts. The problem was, no one else volunteered! When they realized they were *it*, they were not sure where to begin on such a large surface.

The criteria for the window given by the library consisted of the dates, times of the book sale, and specific instructions to use the library's aviator penguin logo, "in its exact colors and dress." The design was easy enough. The major problem became how to do all the necessary lettering in a straight line and the correct lengths.

Because it was a window, Barb and Mary Rose had to continually think in mirror images and inside outs. They tried taping a line but their ladder would not reach high enough. The letter spacing was crucial: Book Sale and not Bo okSale. It took a good stretch of imagination to come up with the solution. They sketched out the letters' placements

on paper, taped the paper to the opposite side of the window and then "merely" painted from the now template. *You ladies are brilliant!* complimented the librarian when she saw the perfect letterings.
