Mary A. Exline



Mary A. Exline, an artist and Springfield Art Guild (SAG) member since 2000, died on June 30, 2017. Mary was a delightful lady and wonderful artist. Mary was a member of the Art League and had a studio at the Cyan Studio Crystal City of Arlington, VA and an Associate Artist at the

Lorton Workhouse Art Center. She has participated in many shows, including recent solo shows. In October 2016, she had a show of 22 oil paintings for "Song of the Woods" abstract expressionism show at Green Spring Gardens Park in Annandale, VA in the historical house. In April 2017, Mary's show was at the 1st Stage in Tyson's Corner.

Mary was born and raised in Washington, D.C., surrounded by art in her childhood home. While Mary's mother and older sister took art classes, as a child Mary was more interested in tap and ballet lessons. Mary believed it was the result of her surroundings that she developed a desire to learn about art and interior design.

In high school, Mary took art and metal shop classes learning how to create jewelry in silver and stone. She earned an M.F.A. in interior design at the National Art Academy of Washington, DC. Once married and raising a family, she had little time to develop her creative interests, but growing up in WDC provided Mary the opportunity to visit its wonderful art galleries. Admiring that beautiful art made her want to surround herself with paintings.

In her late 20s, attending an art and crafts fair with her sister Paula, they admired a small painting of strawberries. Paula pushed Mary to try her hand at painting. Paula's encouragement was the incentive Mary needed. Her first painting was a landscape of a fishing shack at the water's edge inspired by memories of visiting the cranberry bogs in New Jersey.

That was the beginning of Mary's love of painting. Mary hungered to develop herself as an artist, but there never seemed to be enough hours in the day to follow her dreams. Mary began a self-taught journey into art, studying art books and attending art shows and galleries to study other artists' work and techniques.



When it became possible for Mary to take classes, she enrolled in workshops and attended WC classes at the Art League in Alexandria, VA. Mary changed course and began oil painting. Attending Rob Vander Zee classes since 2008, she began to develop her personal style. After years of impressionist style paintings, in 2012 Mary began her journey of painting in the style of abstract



expressionism. She was attracted to that style, admiring the work of artist such as Wolf Khan and Brian Rutenberg. Mary saw such freedom in their styles and love for color. Mary wanted to use color in a more exciting way. She decided to leave behind the photographs she felt were enslaving her and go in a new direction. Without photographs, she discovered a more exciting painting experience. Her love for the beauty of trees and forests influenced her painting, using unusual colors not seen in nature.

June 26, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. Pohick Library

- The meeting was called to order by Teresa Brunson while the Acting President Elaine Sevy was running a little late.
- A quorum was present. Attendees were: Teresa Brunson, Sy Wengrovitz, Judy Wengrovitz, Heather Cronin, Claire Bentley, Terry Holman, Mary Rose Janya, Jo Stafford and Elaine Sevy. Once Elaine arrive the meeting was run by her.
- The June 2017 meetings were approved.
- Treasurer's Report: checking ~ \$7114.73, CDs ~ \$5000 in one and \$3000 in the other. We had a lot of expenses this month (rent for the church, June artist judge, etc).
- Secretary Backup: Heather volunteered to be Karen Flann's backup
- It was voted that everyone will rotate being President. Teresa Brunson will start with September. Lydia Jechorek will be Vice President and Membership, Sy will be Treasurer, Karen Flann will be Secretary. At Large Board members will be Heather Cronin, Judy Wengrovitz, Mary Rose Janya, Jo Stafford, and Elaine Sevy.
- Claire Bentley and Terry Holman gave an update on the Greenspring show. They met with Bill Tuseling from GS, and he is trying to find a way to get credit card ability for all the art shows. Claire, Terry and Jo are going to call him from time to time to remind him to do that. Based on the answers she got back from the board members via email, she has put in for SAG to have our 2018 art show in November.
- 275th Anniversary of Fairfax County/SAG involvement. Volunteers include: Elaine Sevy, Jan Peterson, Barb Aigen, Claire Bentley, Karen Flann and Thea Rossi Barron. We thanked everyone for their help and time.
- Accotink Plein Air Partnership Update: Elaine is going to explore a vendor contract with FCPA and Event Bee signup possibility for SAG workshops. She will let the board know what she finds out. Also, Marni Maree is scheduled to

teach a watercolor/sketching plein air workshop in October, and Phoebe Peterson will be teaching an oil painting plein air workshop in September.

• Rotating Presidents. We asked if anyone on the board would like to select a month now for their rotation. Teresa Brunson selected September 2017, Elaine Sevy selected January 2018, and Sy Wengrovitz selected April 2018. Phoebe Twichell Peterson to teach Plein Air Oil Painting Workshop at Lake Accotink



Phoebe Twichell Peterson. an instructor in oil painting at the Lorton Workhouse Arts Center, is teaching a SAG-sponsored **Plein Air Oil Painting Workshop** at Lake Accotink Park on Saturday, Sept. 23, 9:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m. The rain date will Sunday, Sept. 24, 9:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m.

Students will focus on the basics of painting outside in the landscape. Setting up, blocking in, capturing the effects of light, and sorting out all those greens will be addressed. Rather than rotely copying every detail of the landscape, students will learn to simplify, abstract and edit what they see. This cultivation of perceptual discrimination will lead to more creative and unique interpretations of the landscape.

SAG member John Nicholson, who takes her classes, recommended her, and we are thrilled she accepted since many of our members paint in oils and have expressed interest in taking a course such as this one.

Phoebe's paintings have been exhibited in numerous group and solo shows, the most recent being the 2017 Chesapeake Fine Arts Studio Artists, Crystal Moll Gallery, Baltimore, MD, and her 2016 Small Works solo show at the Workhouse Arts Center in Lorton.

She graduated with a Bachelor of Arts, Magna Cum Laude, Phi Beta Kappa from Middlebury College, VT, in 1986. She also studied graphic design at The School of Visual Arts in New York, NY, 1986-1988. Phoebe's Artist Statement: "I paint because I cherish the creative process, love to experiment, and enjoy seeing colors and abstract shapes that others might overlook."

"I grew up in New England with four siblings, several lovable dogs, and an enormous cat named Whisker (minus the "s" because as a little girl I trimmed off all his whiskers but one). Our childhood summers were spent on Cuttyhunk Island, Massachusetts. We spent countless hours exploring the relatively wild island, and I enjoyed rowing in the harbor in a small wooden rowboat that my father had built for me. We were surrounded by family friends, a mother who loved to garden and swim, and a father who loved to sail and build things. As an adult the colors, imagery and memories of the island and its residents still seem to find their way into my paintings."

I began painting in oil about 14 years ago, taking lessons from the late Jennifer Schoechle. Jennifer had a classical approach and taught me everything from the methods of various Old Masters, to color theory, to anatomy and portraiture, to how to and the importance of cleaning your paint brushes. She was inspirational! I have also studied with other wonderful local artists, including Adrienne Kralick and Priscilla Treacy, concentrating on portraiture and still life. In 2013, after retiring from my practical Washington career, I was finally able to make art my full-time endeavor.

As I became more confident in my work, I did a number of portraits of dogs for friends. I loved capturing the dog's likeness as well as its spirit and expression. I did a couple more portraits for shows and was hooked. So, I set out to paint the ten most popular breeds in the US, according to AKC registrations. Most of the "models" were from photos taken from dog rescue websites. In some cases I used more than one dog to create a representative image for a breed. I love the impact of the oversize heads, especially for the small breeds. Forty square feet of canine portraiture! "Ten Best Friends" was my first solo-show, at the Frame Factory in Vienna, VA, in 2016. The paintings will again be shown at the Barrel Oak Winery in Delaplane, VA from Sept. 14 – Nov. 6, 2017.

I enjoy painting other animals as well. After visiting a friend's farm in my home state of South Dakota, I painted several of his farm animals, including horses, cows and chickens. I also do landscape and still life painting.

My work has been shown at many galleries in Virginia, Maryland and Washington, DC, including Art at the Mill, Arlington Arts Gallery, Falls Church Arts, the Fairfax County Plum Center, Vienna Art Society, the Museum of Contemporary Art Gallery (MOCA) in Georgetown, Avenue Beau Sejour and Studio on the Green in Great Falls, the Yellow Barn Gallery at Glen Echo, and The Frame Factory in Vienna.
