A Tribute to Judy Wengrovitz

Tuesday before Thanksgiving, **Judy Wengrovitz**, one of Springfield Art Guild's founding members, transitioned from this world to the next and is no longer with us in person, but in spirit and memories. Judy inspired many artists and always had a smile on her face. We are sad she will not be with us to celebrate the 50th anniversary of this organization in 2019. The board wishes to share some of memories the guild members have as our own as a personal tribute to her. We love you Judy and we will miss you.

SAG Memories:

- "My earliest memory of Judy was at Lake Accotink outside for some kind of meeting which I no longer remember when I was a new member to SAG. There was a table that had Judy and Sy already seated and I joined them. They were both so nice to me it made me feel instantly welcomed into the guild and I just knew I liked her. However my favorite memories were of trying to beat Judy to Goodwin House on days of drop off and pick up. I used to say "Why can't you be on time? You always have to make me get up so early" to be here before her and Sy. She definitely kept me on my toes." Donnalynne Lefever
- "I met Judy when I joined Springfield Art Guild (SAG). Judy was an amazing dynamo in a small package. When I think of Judy, I think of a warm and very generous person with both her time and talent. I can't imagine how many local artists Judy worked with over the years, both as students and through SAG, but her art legacy will be carried on through all the artists she touched. Judy always expressed surprise, a bit of disbelief, and great pride that SAG continues to thrive after all these years. One of my favorite memories of Judy was when she spoke about plein air painting at a guild meeting. She brought her personalized painting kit with a number of items she designed and Sy made for her. As she took all of her painting gear out of her small suitcase it was similar to watching the magic of Mary Poppins' carpetbag. Sy was the only thing that didn't fit into the bag as she handed him an umbrella which he then stood over her head demonstrating how he did it on location." Lydia Jechorek

- Judy and I met during a water aerobics class. As we marched up and down the length of the pool doing exercises, she learned I loved watercolor painting and told me about the Springfield Art Guild. Having just retired on disability, Judy and SAG were a Godsend. Joining SAG changed my life, and I learned that sweet, humble Judy was an award-winning watercolor artist and one of SAG's founders. Her smiling, encouraging presence greeted all of us at each SAG meeting and most events. She and Sy were at every board meeting, sharing their expertise, suggesting judges, and so much more. - "Judy was a very close friend of mine for almost fifty years. We co-chaired many art functions for the Springfield Art Guild, Potomac Valley Watercolorists, and the Virginia Watercolor Society. This was so typical of Judy, up for a fun adventure and enjoying herself so much. Another favorite memory I have is the event honoring her we held at the Springfield Art Guild, complete with cake and buttons that said, "we love Judy" She got me aside and asked if it was okay to take a handful for her kids and grandchildren. - Sy was in a show at the Ellipse Gallery, when it was run by Trudi VanDyke. It was a show on clothing, so naturally featured Sy's carvings. WENGROVITZ JUDITH WENGROVITZ Judith Wengrovitz, 87, of Springfield, VA passed away surrounded by loving family on November 20, 2018. She is survived by her husband, Seymour Wengrovitz, her three sons, Michael (Debbie), David (Anne), and Phillip (Carolyn) Wengrovitz as well as her five grandchildren: Steven (Dan), Dan (Julia), Lauren, Andrew and Austin Wengrovitz.

Born in Brooklyn, NY, on January 3, 1931 to Harry and Hilda Kanarick, Judy spent her early years establishing and developing a life-long passion for art. She graduated from Hunter College in Manhattan with a

Bachelor of Arts degree and a major in art education.

During her time at Hunter, she met and later married her husband Seymour in 1952. They moved to Springfield, VA to set up a home and raise their three sons, Michael, Phillip, and David. During her time in Springfield, Judy turned her art passion into a career, becoming a professional artist and winning numerous art awards from shows throughout the years. Some of her numerous awards and honors include a listing in the "Who's Who in American Art," a recipient of the Equal Merit award from the Art League at the Torpedo Factory, the Award of Excellence and Best in Show Award from the Virginia Watercolor Society, and the Excellence Award from the National League of American Pen Women. Her involvement within the art community and her extraordinary watercolor paintings earned her several prominent presidential positions with the Springfield Art Guild, Virginia Watercolor Society, Potomac Valley Watercolorists, and the Alexandria Branch of the National League of American Pen Women. Such experience and success within the art community allowed her to work on her latest project of hosting her own TV program called "Welcome to the Painter's Palette."

Her residence for the last year has been at Greenspring Village in Springfield, VA, where she enjoyed spreading her knowledge about watercolor techniques to some of the residents through the art classes she taught there.

Art Show UPDATE

Monday December 17 - Show Take Down

Monday, December 17 – show take down and pick up art 10:45 to noon. Artists must pick up on this date or arrange pickup by a friend. There is no storage space.

SHOW UPDATE

This show has been quite a success already with 7 paintings sold to date! And there are still about three weeks left for all that beautiful work to be seen. I do not even want to think about taking it down, but that will be happening on December 17. We will be sending out emails to those who volunteered to help with that process. Some of you have wondered what the policy is when someone buys a painting at Green Spring. Here is our procedure:

- ➤ If the buyer pays with cash or check. The main desk collects the payment and will contact the artist.
- ➤ If it is a credit card sale, then they call us and we collect the payment and notify the artist of the sale.
- ➤ Checks will be sent out by the end of the show minus the 20% commission to Green Springs.
- If the buyer is from out of town and must take the painting with them at purchase, then the artist needs to bring a replacement that is a similar size and quality. We will need to make a new label for it.
- > Buyers will usually pick up their paintings at the end of the show.

Join SAG-Led Nature Journaling in December

Nature Journaling Monday Dec. 10th, 3:00-5:00 p.m._at Lake Accotink Park

Need a respite from crowded malls and traffic? Consider joining us for 2 hours of blissful peace enjoying nature's beauty. December and the winter months may seem bleak but it's the best time of year to see birds.

Thanks to Lake Accotink Photos, a Facebook site created by local photographer Mike Murray, I discovered that Hooded Mergansers, a species of small duck, winters over at Lake Accotink Park. I'm in love and am on a mission to see and sketch them. Come along!!!!

We may also see the resident pair of Bald Eagles as well as Wood Ducks, Great Blue Herons, Cormorants, Kingfishers, and so many others.

In addition to art supplies, I highly recommend bringing binoculars and something to sit on. A chair is nice, but even a comfy towel will do. Dress in layers. It may be cold but the sun can warm you up quickly.

Nature Journaling improves your observation skills, helps you become comfortable sketching and painting outdoors, and doing studies that inspire future paintings. Nature Journaling also opens a door to a fascinating world of local natural wonders, stimulating your imagination and creativity.

A good basic Nature Journaling kit includes: 6x8" or 5x7" sketchbook (at least 90 lb. weight paper to handle light watercolor washes), HB drawing pencil, pencil sharpener, Kneaded eraser, a waterproof ink pen such as a Pigma Micron 01 or 05, set of watercolor pencils (Derwent is a good brand), a small container for water (film canisters work great), Pentel Aquash Water Brush and Paper Towels. Or bring whatever materials you are comfortable using. Also bring your cell phone and/or a camera for photo references, and binoculars.

We will meet by the park's marina and venture forth from there.

Directions to Lake Accotink Park (Don't use GPS devices):

Take Springfield/644W exit from I-95, which puts you on Old Keene Mill Road. At 3rd stoplight, turn right on Hanover Rd. Continue on Hanover (through residential section) to Highland Ave. Turn Left.

Turn right on Accotink Park Rd. The park entrance is on the left (an industrial area is on the right). Accotink Park Rd. continues here. Take it until you reach the small parking lot past the dam and railroad trestle.

As the "Year of the Bird" winds down, we're planning two special events to celebrate our beautiful local native and migratory birds. Details are still being finalized but include:



- 1. Audubon Christmas Bird Count (CBC) at the Accotink Bay Wildlife Refuge at Fort Belvoir, Sunday, Dec 30. Join me in observing and learning about the birds you want to sketch and paint. Audubon's representative will provide details the first part of December, and I will share them with you. Get outside and enjoy a firsthand look at the wild birds who reside with us. For beginning birders like me, Audubon held a Christmas Bird Count Workshop, Dec 2, at the National Wildlife Federation in Reston, Va. If you would like to get some training, I will try to find more Audubon CBC training opportunities and/or see if we can arrange a training session.
- 2. Indoor Nature Journaling Sketchbook Workshop Celebrating Local Wild Birds, Dec 31st, 1:30-4:00 p.m., Richard Byrd Library meeting room in Springfield. We will have a fun, learning experience detailing our birding experiences in our sketchbooks. Participation in the Dec 10 Nature Journaling outing and/or the Audubon Christmas Bird Count is not required to participate. For inspiration, a variety of nature journaling pages and books offering ideas, will be provided for your use. A recommended list of supplies will be provided, though markers, waterproof ink pens, water brushes, and other materials will be available for you to experiment with. Please bring a dish to share for a potluck. Space is limited to 15 people so please let me know if you plan to attend.




