## Mary Proenza – Successful Artist, Writer and Professor

Mary Proenza's work explores social, political, environmental, and personal themes, and starts from a sense that the world is inexhaustibly interesting. She combines perception and other visual sources with memory, imagination, and narrative, and she works back and forth between drawing, painting, printmaking, and writing. Mary finds that an



interdisciplinary practice sharpens her vision, illuminates unexpected facets of subjects, and generates new approaches and ideas.

She begins most projects with perceptual drawing and painting.

She completes some works entirely onsite, often over many sessions. As she works at specific locations


over time, visual scenes conflate with historical, social, political, environmental, and personal concerns. Observation is a consistent spur to her curiosity and imagination, whether working onsite or in the studio. In the studio, I further explore perceptual images through variations of media, scale, emphasis, light, and color, as well as through further associations and invention.

One of Mary's current projects is a graphic memoir combining paintings, drawings, prints, and writing; a chapter of this has been published in Rosebud magazine.



She believes that all art is fundamentally communicative and exists on a continuum. Along with creative work, teaching puts her into close contact with those essential aspects, as does writing about the work of other artists.

## Nature Journaling Mondays, April 8

### April 8, 5:00-7:00 p.m. at Lake Accotink Park

# Nature Journaling Mondays, April 8 at Lake Accotink Park, NEW TIME: 5-7 p.m. (There will not be a Nature Journaling outing on April 22, since I will be traveling.)

**It's Spring wildflower time!!!!** So on April 8, we will explore the trail along Accotink Creek where we can hope to see Virginia Bluebells, Spring Beauties, Bluetts, Trout Lilies, and maybe some others.

To celebrate *International Beaver Day* (April 7th), we also will go in search of some Beaver activity in the park for the 2nd part of our outing. The best time of day to view Beaver activity is dusk so we will aim for about 6:30 p.m. I will scope out the best place to see them ahead of time. We can stay until the park closes at around 7:30 p.m.



In addition to art supplies, definitely bring binoculars if you have them (I will bring a couple of extra pairs) and something

to sit. A chair is nice, but even a comfy towel will do. Dress in layers and wear comfortable shoes that you don't mind getting wet and a little muddy.

Nature Journaling helps you become more comfortable sketching and painting outdoors, and doing studies that inspire future paintings.

A good basic Nature Journaling kit includes: 6x8" or 5x7" sketchbook (at least 90 lb. weight paper to handle light watercolor washes), HB drawing pencil, pencil sharpener, Kneaded eraser, a waterproof ink pen such as a Pigma Micron 01 or 05, set of watercolor pencils (Derwent is a good brand), a small container for water (film canisters work great), Pentel Aquash Water Brush and Paper Towels. Or bring whatever materials you are comfortable using. Also bring your cell phone and/or a camera for photo references, and binoculars.



**Please NOTE:** For this outing, we will meet in the large parking on the left as you drive into the park on Accotink Park Road. It's the first parking area you will see if you are new to the park. As you enter the lot, turn to the left and park in the far left-hand corner near the trail head.

#### Directions to Lake Accotink Park (Don't use GPS devices):

Take Springfield/644W exit from I-95, which puts you on Old Keene Mill Road. At 3rd stoplight, turn right on Hanover Rd. Continue on Hanover (through residential section) to Highland Ave. Turn Left. Turn right on Accotink Park Rd. The park entrance is on the left (an industrial area is on the right). Accotink Park Rd. continues here. Take it until you reach the large parking lot on the left, before you reach the dam. This lot is below the railroad trestle.

### City Nature Challenge DC 2019 Saturday, April 27, 4-7:00 p.m., Lake Accotink Park Meet in the large parking lot below the train trestle.

Plans are underway for SAG to be a part of the exciting City Nature Challenge DC 2019, April 26-29.

During the City Nature Challenge, people all over the world take photos of wild flora and fauna, and upload them to the iNaturalist website, either via their smart phones or a computer. The software suggests identifications, and then actual human naturalists complete the identification process. It is easy and free to users, contributes to important research, and opens people's eyes to the life around us.

You will need to download the free iNaturalist app to your cell phone ahead of time and create an account. The app is pretty intuitive but you can visit the official website for basic instructions on how it works:

https://citynaturechallengedc.org. I have been through training so I can assist you the day of the event.

We will explore the park, snapping photos for the Challenge beginning at 4:00 p.m. Around 6:00 p.m., we will gather at the park's Marina area to enjoy some food together (bring a picnic and some yummies for all), while we share our experiences, and sketch and write about them in our journals.


