SAG Speaker is Abstract Artist Martin Cervantez

Martin J. Cervantez enlisted in the Army Signal Corps in July 1986 as an Illustrator. His most prestigious assignment was Artist in Residence at the U.S. Army Center of Military History where he was responsible for capturing the Army's history through art. He deployed to Afghanistan in support of OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM 2008, and 2011. During these deployments he produced artwork that visually recorded Soldiers' experiences the Army's achievements. Two of his oil paintings were recently featured in the National Constitution Center's public exhibition "Art of the American Soldier" in Philadelphia. Martin is a self-taught artist who has created art





since he was a child. He's used art as his own therapy during recovery from his recent six surgeries. Martin also advocates for veteran's art programs, and was involved at the USO Ft Belvoir, and Walter Reed; Warrior Writers from Philadelphia, and Combat Paper New Jersey. Cervantez is also known for turning the Workhouse guard towers into static kaleidoscopes by using colored films on the windows of the towers. creating a dynamic piece of art that changes with time of day, and position of view. Martin is the 2017 recipient of the Prince William County Kathleen Seefeldt Award for Best Artist. His most recent public art project was the 2018 Berlin Airlift mural/assemblage, in Wiesbaden, Germany. Martin's work is currently on public display in a solo exhibition at the Center for the Arts, Manassas, until 31 August.

Nature Journaling Fall Migration – focus on Monarchs, Part I Saturday Sept. 14, 10:00 AM to 12:00 PM and Fall Migration – focus on Monarchs, Part II Monday Sept. 23, 5:00 PM to 7:00 PM

Join us at Lake Accotink Park to enjoy and sketch these beautiful, large butterflies

We've already been seeing Monarchs and Common Buckeyes -- two butterflies known for migrating South in the Fall. Visit <u>www.journeynorth.org</u> to learn about and track the Monarch's amazing journey. September is Mushroom month too!

Join us at Lake Accotink Park (7500 Accotink Park Road Springfield, VA) to enjoy and sketch these beautiful, large butterflies as they stop to feed and lay their eggs on Milkweed, their only host plant. We will be checking for and sketching Monarch caterpillars too.

Buckeyes and many other butterflies and insects also will be enjoying Fall blooming Asters and Goldenrod.

If you'd like to try iNaturalist to help identify plants and animals you encounter, upload the iNaturalist app and set up an account. I will be at the park early and can help you before we begin the walk. Make sure your smart phone is fully charged.

Please NOTE: We will meet in the Marina area. Parking is limited near the marina, but you can park in the large parking lot on the left, below the railroad trestle. Once in the lot, turn right and park in the far right-hand corner. Take the sidewalk to the right to reach the Marina. (See below for directions to Lake Accotink Park.)

In addition to your smart phone and art supplies, definitely bring binoculars if you have them (I will bring a couple of extra pairs) and something to sit on. A chair is nice, but even a comfy towel will do. A hat is a good idea, and wear comfortable shoes that you don't mind getting wet and a little muddy.

Nature Journaling is a fun, relaxing way to learn about our local plants and animals. For artists, it helps you



become more comfortable sketching and painting outdoors, and doing studies that inspire future paintings.

A good basic Nature Journaling kit includes: 6x8" or 5x7" sketchbook (at least 90 lb. weight paper to handle light watercolor washes), HB drawing pencil, pencil sharpener, Kneaded eraser, a waterproof ink pen such as a Pigma Micron 01 or 05, set of watercolor pencils (Derwent is a good brand), a small container for water (film canisters work great), Pentel Aquash Water Brush and Paper Towels. Or bring whatever materials you are comfortable using. Also bring your cell phone and/or a camera for photo references, and binoculars.

Take Springfield/644W exit from I-95, which puts you on Old Keene Mill Road. At 3rd stoplight, turn right on Hanover Rd. Continue on Hanover (through

residential section) to Highland Ave. Turn Left. Turn right on Accotink Park Rd. The park entrance is on the left (an industrial area is on the right). Accotink Park Rd. continues here. Take it until you reach the marina area. Parking is limited so you can park in the large parking lot on the left, below the railroad trestle. Once in the lot, turn right and park in the right-hand corner. Take the sidewalk to the right to reach the Marina.

2019 Green Springs Art Show "Garden Dreams" October 28 – December 16



This summer is a great time to create artwork for the Green Spring Gardens art exhibit "Garden Dreams". This is our BIG show! The venue is the horticulture center at the lovely and inspiring Green Springs Garden Park on Braddock Rd just past Little River Turnpike in Alexandria.

This year the art will be juried in by professional artist **Susan O'Neil**. The subject of the artwork **must** be flora, fauna, or local landscape. The entry fee is \$10 per piece and \$25 for three. Three entries are the limit. Ribbons and monetary awards will be given at the reception. This year we have more space to hang, so more of you will have a chance to see your work on the walls. We are also planning a craft show and sale during the reception (November 3rd). Registration for this exhibit begins in September. For more information email Heather Cronin at <u>hrcronin8520@gmail.com</u> or call 703-975-6269.

This is a Juried Show with 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and Honorable Mention ribbons to be awarded. This year we are adding a Best in Show in honor of our founder, the late Judy Wengrovitz. <u>Artists must register and volunteer by October 14</u>. There is a 30% commission on all sales that will benefit the Friends of Green Spring Gardens Park.

Schedule

October 14 – Registration & payment due. This show is open to SAG MEMBERS ONLY. Members may enter up to 3 pieces. **Fee:** \$10 each or 3 for \$25. Make sure your membership is up to date.

<u>Receiving:</u> Monday, October 28 - 12:00-1:00 <u>Judging:</u> 1:00 pm-2:00; <u>Show installation</u> from 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm. <u>Pick up</u> unselected art from 2:00 pm - 3:00 pm

Reception and Awards: Sunday, November 3, 1:00 – 3:00 pm

Show take down and pick up art: Monday, December 16, 10:45 to noon. Artists must pick up on this date or arrange pickup by a friend. There is no storage space.

Submission Criteria:

• Artwork must focus on flora, fauna, or local (DC, MD, VA) landscapes.

- Artwork must be for sale and if selected stay on exhibition from October 28 to December 16, 2019 in Green Spring Gardens Park
- SAG members may submit up to 3 pieces of artwork no larger than 40" x 40" (including frame)
- Only hangable hand painted, hand drawn or other "original" 2-D art, created in the last 2 years, will be considered. Traditional photographs and digitally enhanced photographs are welcome. **Drafts, photocopies, offset prints, lithographs or copies of already published art will not be permitted.**
- All artwork must be for sale and suitably framed. Entries must be ready to hang with hooks and wire and be protected by glass or plexi-glass when necessary.
- Saw tooth hangers, clips, wet canvases, soiled or poorly matted works will not be accepted, nor will artwork previously shown at a SAG sponsored Green Spring Gardens show. Exposed nails must be covered by a backing and or tape.
- Artists making sales shall submit a 30% commission to Green Spring Gardens Park at the close of the show and are responsible for Virginia sales tax which Green Spring Gardens Park will collect. All sales will be made through Green Spring Gardens Park. Artists will be provided sales details when work is accepted for the show.
- All artists shall be solely and exclusively responsible to insure properly and adequately their work and property. By submitting this application, the artist agrees to fully and finally release the Springfield Art Guild, its directors, officers, employees or volunteers and employees of Green Springs involved with the exhibit of any and all responsibility for any damage or loss to any artwork during the time of the exhibition, its set up and take down. Be aware that insurance policies in effect will not provide coverage for damage or loss due to fire, theft or burglary and vandalism. The artist agrees to maintain their own insurance if they so choose. The artist agrees to assume all risk of damage to or loss of his/her own art from whatever cause. The transport, installation and removal of the artworks are not covered by insurance.


