Bill Firestone Presents at Our March Meeting

Unexpected color, active brushstrokes, a penchant for abstraction and sometimes a little touch of humor all combine to create strong yet inviting paintings that appeal to a broad audience.

Firestone completed his BFA from Virginia Commonwealth University and moved to Washington DC to work in the graphic design field. His strong background in photography as well as his visual interpretations of everything from tractor-trailers to London and Paris street scenes allows him to record his unique inspirations.

Countless judges throughout his career have recognized his illustration and fine art work and his paintings hang in many public and private collections. Galleries in DC, Virginia and North Carolina represent him. Illustration clients include publications such as Chesapeake Bay Magazine and the Washington Post Magazine, as well as graphic design firms, and advertising agencies.

His studio is at the Workhouse Arts Center, a former prison complex in Lorton, Virginia.



Exploring for Signs of Spring

- Sat, March 14, 10am-Noon (Taking the loop trail to the left of the dam). Park in the large parking lot near the train trestle.
- Mon, March 23, 5:00-7:00p.m (Sketch Hike along Accotink Creek) Park in the large lot in the back lefthand corner near the trail head.

It's been a warmer than usual Winter, and the first day of Spring arrives March 19. The forest is changing quickly so there will be a lot to see and hear.

Let's get out on the trails and explore for signs of an early Spring — early ephemeral wildflowers, late Winter birds and Spring migrants, and of course, a visit to the Eagles Nest. Stars and Stripes have not abandoned the nest, so we could have little ones soon.

It's an easy hike, once you get past the first incline, along the 4-mile loop, and there's a viewing bench.

On Monday, we begin our sketch hike at 5:00 p.m., meeting at the trail head located in the large parking lot, back left-hand side as you drive in.

I'm already hearing Spring Peepers and Wood Frogs in the vernal pools located in this area. We should see early signs of Bluebells and other Spring wildflowers.

In addition to art supplies, definitely bring binoculars if you have them (I will bring a couple of extra pairs) and something to sit on in case there's too many of us for the bench. A chair is nice, but even a comfy towel will do.

Nature Journaling improves your observation skills, helps you become comfortable sketching and painting outdoors, and doing studies that inspire future paintings. Nature Journaling also opens a door to a fascinating world of local natural wonders, stimulating your imagination and creativity.



includes: 6x8" or 5x7"sketchbook (at least 100 lb. weight paper to handle light watercolor washes), HB drawing pencil, pencil sharpener, Kneaded eraser, a waterproof ink pen such as a Pigma Micron 01 or 05, set of watercolor pencils (Derwent is a good brand), a small container for water (film canisters work great), Pentel Aquash Water Brush and Paper Towels. Or bring whatever materials you are comfortable using.

Also bring your cell phone and/or a camera for photo references, and binoculars.

Please NOTE: For both March outings, we will meet in the large parking lot on the left as you drive into the park on Accotink Park Road. It's the first parking area you will see if you are new to the park. Directions to Lake Accotink Park (Don't use GPS devices):

Take Springfield/644W exit from I-95, which puts you on Old Keene Mill Road. At 3rd stoplight, turn right on Hanover Rd. Continue on Hanover (through residential section) to Highland Ave. Turn Left.Turn right on Accotink Park Rd. The park entrance is on the left (an industrial area is on the right). Accotink Park Rd. continues here. Take it until you reach the large parking lot on the left, before you reach the dam. This lot is below the railroad trestle.
