#### **Blending Aesthetics and Science**

Join Lara Call Gastinger as she talks about her experience as a botanical artist. She will speak about her early career as a botanical illustrator for the *Flora of Virginia* which led to her profession as a botanical artist. She will go through the process of creating and maintaining a perpetual journal and how she creates detailed watercolor paintings.


She has her undergraduate degree in Biology from the University of Virginia and a master's degree in plant ecology from Virginia Tech. She has been awarded two gold medals (2007, 2018) at the Royal Horticultural Society Botanical Art



shows in London and her work is in the Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation. Her artwork appears in the latest *Peterson's Field Guide to Mushrooms* and *ASBA's Botanical Art Techniques Handbook*.

The subjects of her art are artifacts of the natural world and reveal detailed evidence of the natural processes of growth, reproduction, and decay. She finds inspiration in a carrot that has gone to flower, a broken seedpod, twisted roots or insect damage to a leaf. She strives to make a plant portrait in such a way that it reveals its character and uniqueness. Her focus on the small details and celebration of the everyday hopefully inspires others to look a bit deeper and linger a bit longer. She has gained international recognition with the creation of her "perpetual journal" that has inspired naturalists around the world to start their own.

# Help! SAG Needs More Volunteers

In order for SAG to continue to operate efficiently, offer art shows, create newsletters, find monthly speakers, make member directories, organize meetings, and set up sketching and nature journaling events and lots more we need more volunteers. The SAG Board members and advisors and several additional volunteers have been doing a lot over the past few years and could really use some relief and help. Please email\_Danica Holoviak-Arehart at danica.holoviak@gmail.com and let her know what volunteer activity or activities you would like to do. If you can



help in any way! Look through the list and let us know where you can help.

#### Here are a list of activities we need volunteers for:

- 1. Be a SAG Board Member It only requires about 2-4 hours a month
- 2. Be the SAG Treasurer Board Member: It only requires maybe 2-4 hours a month of work. SAG has only a few bills a year (insurance, website hosting) and the treasurer also writes and mails out 8-10 checks total a year to our Featured Speakers. The Treasurer keeps up the listing of checks written. There is a binder that has the listing. The other board members can help assist, train and answer any questions. Sy was Treasurer for 9 years and kept the book in order.
- 3. **Newsletter Coordinator**: Create the monthly newsletter layout. You do not write any articles (unless you want to). All articles come from SAG Board and non-Board members. Members provide the articles plus the images. We are currently using an easy basic Microsoft Word document template but you can create the newsletter with whatever you want. Teresa Brunson will be available to assist and train. This job can be shared by more than one person if you want.
  - a. Members are asked to **submit articles** for newsletter to the coordinator
  - b. Layout a monthly column for the newsletter
- 4. **Springfield Civic Association article:** Send a (usually monthly) article about our featured speaker to the Springfield Civic Association. You do not have to write the article. The featured speaker provides the article and images for the SAG newsletter and to Elaine Sevy (member currently doing this job) to send to the association. Elaine will assist and train you. This association supports SAG through their Facebook group and their newsletter.
- 5. Online SAG website art shows: Volunteers to organize future online SAG website art shows. We had our first online website art show and it was a success. In fact it is still going on. If you haven't seen it take a look at our website <u>http://www.springfieldartguild.org/exhibitions/</u>. We have several members that can train you in how to organize and plan the show. It will require a few people but one person to be the lead. An example of the kind of duties required is:

- Writing an article for our newsletter about the upcoming online art show that you are planning.
- Keeping an organized listing of all art pieces, organizing a theme and dates of the show and things like that. For our first and current online website show we had a total of 53 art pieces so it is not a huge amount to keep a list of. We have several members that can assist and train you. Much of the organizing, writing of the prospectus, registration form etc. has already been done.
- Making sure our SAG Facebook volunteer is announcing it on Facebook.

- 6. **Green Spring Coordinator:** Two or more volunteers to be in charge of the Green Spring Art Show of 2022. Unfortunately Green Springs will not be having any art shows in 2021. Heather Cronin and Joanna Stafford will be happy to assist and provide training.
- 7. P.O. Box: Volunteer to check the SAG P.O. Box and provide mail to designated Board member
- 8. Website Assistant: Assist with the SAG website. Teresa Brunson will provide training.
- 9. **Directory Assistant**: Help with the member directory (in Sept/Oct). Lydia Jechorek will provide training.
- 10. **Facebook Coordinator**: Do postings to promote SAG and help facilitate postings for members when needed
- 11. Virtual Studio Art Time Assistant: Assist coordinating Zoom Virtual Open studio
- 12. Liaison with Grace Church: Board will coordinate any needs to contact them. Volunteer will report to board interactions
- 13. **Speaker Suggestions**: Membership research and provide ideas for future speakers and provide to coordinator
- 14. **Speaker Coordinator**: Keep a list of the speakers that are selected by the membership and Board. Send out (email) 10 speaker contracts to the monthly featured speakers. The contract is already written so you would just type in the speakers name and dates.
- 15. **Thumb Drive Librarian**: Keeper of the thumb drives and responsible for signing out the Thumb Drives for Judy's TV Watercolor Painting class
- 16. **DVD Librarian:** Keeper of the 30+ Instructional Painting DVDs. You will need to store the DVDs and be in charge of keeping a list of who signs them out and returns them back to you.

# **Oriental Brush Painting Nature Workshop**

#### Online via ZOOM

Learn to paint a few basic strokes using ink and color on rice paper to create beautiful roses. In this oriental art technique you will load your brush in layers of color. When you put your brush to the paper the colors come out in the reverse order on the paper. This art form is "food for the soul"—it is active meditation that teaches you to use your chi (energy) to produce a freestyle, beautiful piece of art.

This 2-hour workshop (via Zoom) on oriental brush painting of Roses using Chinese watercolors is taught by international award winning artist Darlene Kaplan. A picture of the subject will be emailed to all participants to follow during the class. You will set up your table to paint as the instructor guides



you along with step-by-step directions and checks each participant's progress from time to time.


<u>Please order your supplies in advance</u> due to shortage of employees and shipping delays during the pandemic. Order your supplies from <u>awesomeartsupply.com</u> (select <u>Asian/Oriental/SumiSupply</u>). Supplies list:

- 1. One Box of Marie's CHINESE Watercolors ACS-90C12 Marie Sumi Watercolors-12 Color Set- 12 ml.
- 2. Bottled ink (cheapest will work to get started)
- Flow Brush (Chinese art Brush) ABF-3FB03 <u>Best Combination Flow Brush</u> (watercolor brushes will NOT work)
- 4. Paper Roll APS-57P5R Pi-Ma Paper Roll
- 5. Holding dishes for color (white ceramic small saucers will work)
- 6. Mixing dishes for mixing (white ceramic)
- 7. Container for water (2 jars one for dirty water and one for clean)
- 8. Paper towels
- 9. One yard of white fleece fabric (fabric store)

This workshop will be online through the Zoom platform. Registered participants will be sent the connection information via email two days before the workshop and again one hour before the workshop. You may attend on a computer, tablet, or smartphone.


