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## My Creative Journey



Like almost every artist I know, I grew up constantly creating. I mostly lived in crumby neighborhoods so it wasn't safe to play outside, and often there wasn't a yard or a park to play in anyway. My parents

quickly discovered that the best way to keep

me occupied, inside, and safe was to shower me with art supplies.

My grandmother, who made her living as an oil painter, introduced me to the finest sable brushes, linen canvas, and the joys of roaming the aisles of Blick Art Supply. When my now brother-in-law saw my room in my family's home for the first time he remarked that it seemed more like a studio than a bedroom. No matter how tight money got, my parents prioritized my arts education. They even helped me lie about my age to be able to take a painting class I was interested in.



Though I have always loved creating, I never expected to make a career out of it. My parents rightly pushed me toward college and a regular old 9-5 type of lifestyle with health insurance. But, after just a few years of that I found myself setting up shop at the kitchen table with an X-Acto and a tiny cutting mat. Then I bought a bigger table and put it in the middle of my living room. Then I needed a lighted swing arm magnifying glass to be able to cut smaller details. Then I needed a massive collection of papers. Things spiraled in the best way.



In 2016 I decided to see if any galleries would be interested in my work, and within 3 months I had 29 pieces hung in a small group show. I sold my first piece for \$125 and I was




hooked. Since then I've managed to participate in more than 50 group shows and have been awarded 12 solo exhibits in the past 4 years. My work has been written about in The Washington Post, The Jealous Curator, Colossal, and BmoreArt. I won a 2021 Maryland State Arts Council Independent Artist Award, the 2021 Municipal Arts Society of Baltimore Artist Travel Prize, and was invited to participate in the 2021 Shanghai International Paper Art Biennale. In 2019 I was invited to participate in the Xianyang Papercutters Association annual exhibit in Xi'an, China. My work has been acquired by The Colored Girls' Museum in Philadelphia and The Museum of International Folk Art in Santa Fe.

Most of that was done while working a full time job. To say that I am a workaholic is an understatement. During my talk on October 13th I'll share how I navigate (somewhat successfully) my work/life balance while continually trying to outdo myself, how I built my career, and how my style



evolved and re-evolved. Perhaps most importantly, I'll talk about the impact creative communities have had on my work and career. Every artist needs a tribe!

Look at some mixed media work for inspiration and use whatever materials you have at home to create an abstract memory tracing based on feelings, colors, shapes and intuition.

- a substrate (thick paper, cardboard, an old book cover, etc.)
- collage materials (colorful papers, tissue paper, junk mail, magazines, glue or glue stick, scissors)



• mark making tools (pencils, pens, colored pencils, markers, paint, ink, etc.).

#### **RICHARD LEVINE**

Richard Levine, born in Newark, NJ, is a painter and photographer whose professional career has spanned more than 30 years in the graphic arts working for prominent design firms and corporate clients. A graduate of Fairleigh Dickinson University, he studied oil painting for four years with artists Alan Turner and Andrew Lattimore and photography with Gary Winogrand. Additional studies were at Cooper Union and The School of Visual Arts, NYC. Extensive travel throughout the United States, Europe, and Asia have formed the foundation for his personal work. Photo documentary work has included the Darfur refugee camps in Eastern Chad for the International Medical Corps and childhood health conditions in the Mississippi Delta with the Annie E. Casey Foundation. Richard has exhibited widely on the East Coast from Virginia to Maine in both solo and group shows. He is a 2017/18 recipient of a Pollock-Krasner Foundation grant. He won second prize in the 2016 Bethesda Painting Awards. He was awarded a New York State Certificate of Merit for his exhibit: India, A Traveler's Reflections. In September 2016 he was featured cover artist for the Journal of Financial Service Professionals. His documentary work is in the permanent collection of the Museum of Jewish Heritage, New York.
