Stacy Slaten is the Associate Professor of Drawing and Painting and Gallery Director at Northern Virginia Community College in Alexandria, Virginia. Her drawings are exhibited nationally from Five Points Gallery, Torrington, CT; Impasto Art Gallery, Longmont, CO; Las Laguna Gallery, Laguna Beach, CA to local places like Del Ray Artisans Gallery, Alexandria, VA and Vienna Arts Society, Vienna, VA. She earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Drawing and Painting, another in Jewelry Design and Metalsmithing, and one in Human Sciences at Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas,

where she is from. She then earned a Master of Fine Arts degree in Painting from Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. Currently, she lives in Alexandria with her parrot and continues to investigate drawing as a primary expression.

Art Challenge

It's the Two-Hour Photo Interpretation Challenge.

- SAG will supply a photo for you to interpret (not copy).
- Work less than 2 hours per month on your interpretation.
- Use techniques you don't usually use. Play, learn and have fun. There are no rules.
- Display your interpretations at the monthly meeting.

Here is how it works:

- 1. Each month a photo will be placed into the SAG Newsletter.
- 2. You are invited to interpret the photo in any way you want. There are no rules. Use any medium, any size. Do as many interpretations as you like. And, don't worry about framing.

You are urged to take this opportunity to do things you don't normally do. Use different papers and canvas and tools. Use different mediums. Use colors you don't usually use. Stretch your horizons. You are urged not to just copy the photo. Interpret it in your own way. Invent something new! Have fun!

- 3. The intent is for members to use no more than 2 hours per interpretation. If you want to use 56 hours....Seek professional help.
- 4. **EXTRA EXTRA——**-As an extra activity for members, If you would like to display **ANY** of your art at the monthly meeting, just bring it in and display it with the interpretations.

- 6. If you would like to submit photos, please send them to Tom. An effort will be made to include a variety of subjects. Tom will make the selection, and forward them to the Newsletter.

January (Staycation) Nature Journaling Walk to the Bald Eagles' Nest

Monday, Jan 20, 10am to Noon



Lake Accotink Park's resident pair of Bald Eagles — now nicknamed Stars (Female) and Stripes (Male) — are rebuilding their nest. Let's hope that no interlopers, i.e., another adult Bald Eagle or any juveniles disrupt their nesting. A new decade deserves some Eaglets!!!

The devoted couple are nesting in the same area as last year. It's an easy hike along the 4-mile loop, and there's a viewing bench.

Bald Eagle sketching and journaling is worth braving the January cold, so dress in layers, and let's do it!!! Please confirm if you plan to attend.

In addition to art supplies, definitely

bring binoculars if you have them (I will bring a couple of extra pairs) and something to sit on in case there's too many of us for the bench. A chair is nice, but even a comfy towel will do.

Nature Journaling improves your observation skills, helps you become comfortable sketching and painting outdoors, and doing studies that inspire future paintings. Nature Journaling also opens a door to a fascinating world of local natural wonders, stimulating your imagination and creativity.

A good basic Nature Journaling kit includes: 6x8" or 5x7"sketchbook (at least 100 lb. weight paper to handle light watercolor washes), HB drawing pencil, pencil sharpener, Kneaded eraser, a waterproof ink pen such as a Pigma Micron 01 or 05, set of watercolor pencils (Derwent is a good brand), a small container for water (film canisters work great), Pentel Aquash Water Brush and Paper Towels. Or bring whatever materials you are comfortable using.

Also bring your cell phone and/or a camera for photo references, and binoculars.

Please NOTE: For this outing, we will meet in the large parking lot on the left as you drive into the park on Accotink Park Road. It's the first parking area you will see if you are new to the park. As you enter the lot, turn to the right and park in the area closest to the railroad trestle.

Directions to Lake Accotink Park (Don't use GPS devices):

Take Springfield/644W exit from I-95, which puts you on Old Keene Mill Road. At 3rd stoplight, turn right on Hanover Rd. Continue on Hanover (through residential section) to Highland Ave. Turn Left.Turn right on Accotink Park Rd. The park entrance is on the left (an industrial area is on the right). Accotink Park Rd. continues here. Take it until you reach the large parking lot on the left, before you reach the dam. This lot is below the railroad trestle.

A SAG URBAN SKETCHING GROUP IS FORMED

The Board of Directors has approved the creation of The SAG Urban Sketching Group. The coordinator will be Tom Kollins (703-323-8186 ... thomaskkollins@gmail.com).

What is urban sketching? It's a very popular activity in many parts of the world. Hundreds of artists show up at organized outings around the world. It's mostly done outdoors (except in cold or inclement weather). Subject matter is mostly man-made objects and people. Artworks tend to be smaller and done in less time than regular pleinair. While there are rules....We will not be bound by any of them.

For ease of parking and finding venues, we will select only outings located in Northern Virginia. We are fortunate there are so many good locations for sketching near us.

It is suggested you google "urban sketching." There is an enormous amount of material on the internet to give you a full understanding.

Here is how The SAG Urban Sketching Group will work. Each month (beginning in February) an announcement will be published in the Newsletter. The outing will be in the 3d

or 4th week of that month (Our first outing will be in February). Members are responsible for their own transportation. The results of the outings will be shown at the next monthly meeting.

Four Goals of The Urban Sketching Group

- 1. Have some fun with fellow artists.
- 2. Practice skills we might not otherwise use.
- 3. Participants can use the outings as a reconnaissance for plain-air or studio work.
- 4. Outings will always contain a significant social component (usually lunch) so participants can meet and get to know each other.

Our first outing is planned for a weekend (Saturday) in February (3d or 4th week). Because it's winter, this first outing will be inside the Air and Space Museum near Dulles Airport. Full details will be in the February Newsletter.

A Year of Great Sales!

This year has been a very good year for art sales at the Green Spring "Garden Dreams" Art Show and we are thrilled for our members. We took a chance on moving the time from the summer to fall to include the holidays and financially it is paying off. With the show coinciding with more activity at Green Spring, we have had many more sales this year for a total of 13! Several members sold

framed paintings for the first

time.

With 109 entries by 41 Members and 88 paintings selected, we received many compliments that this year our paintings were showing a great deal more skill and composition, boundaries were pushed in some cases, we had more use of materials, delicate brush work as well as intricate rhythms seen in more of our work.



Beyond the atrium and larger room, we were really excited to once again hang our work on the ramp offering more exposure. With the variety of talent we have at SAG, we expanded the show during the reception to included members the chance to sell their Arts and Crafts -- another successful year of sales.

We were honored this year to have Susan O'Neil judge our show. A teacher at Maryland University and the Torpedo Factory, she selected the art that appeared in the show and selected the winners. Susan discussed in depth why certain paintings were selected as the winners and she spent time with our members at our reception discussing member's paintings. Many members shared with me how delighted they were with her enthusiasm and interest in our show and members.
