Introducting our "Characters"



Our SAG Board consists of 9 members:

- President The duties are shared between all Board members with the exception of the SAG Secretary and Treasurer
- Vice President
- Treasurer
- Secretary

Secretary.

Advisory – (6 positions)

A Brief Idea of the Parts They Play

The President – The duties of the president are shared and rotated each month by the Board members except for our Secretary and Treasurer. The president prepares a Meeting Agenda, with input from the Board before Board and membership meetings. This input of the Board members keeps SAG moving ahead. The acting president runs the Membership meeting. Other duties as selected by the President.

The Treasurer –Tracks financial matters, maintains checking account which they report to Board at monthly meetings, and pays bills (which are limited) such as, Guest Speaker honorariums, donations to charities selected by board & to Grace Church, insurance, PO Box, supplies. Track incoming monies such as, dues, donations of show fees, etc. **The Secretary** – Creates minutes for monthly online Board meetings and provides to the Board members. Sends out thank you notes and other duties as selected by the

Vice President – emails the SAG Speaker Contract to each speaker. Keeps the Board members informed of status of the contracts as received. Other duties as selected by the VP.

Advisory Positions – in conjunction with Board officers, the 6 advisory members select one of more of the duties below and/or can present ideas for new programs.

A Variety of Duties They Do

All members are encouraged to be active in all activities so the following are not limited to board members only.

• Liaison: Coordinate monthly in-person meetings with Grace Church.

- **P.O. Box Coordinator:** Distributing pertinent mail to board.
- **Search Party:** Find potential monthly speakers All members are welcome to provide suggestions for the Board to consider
- Monthly Guest Speaker Coordinator
- **Speaker Contract Coordinator:** Email 10 speaker contracts a year to the monthly featured speakers. The contract is already written so you would just type in the speakers name and dates.
- Liaison Springfield Civic Association: Create and email a (bi-monthly) article about our featured speakers to the SCA. Provide featured speaker article and images for SCA newsletter. Elaine Sevy (current liaison) can provide training. This association supports SAG through their Facebook group and their newsletter.
- Newspaper Editor: Articles come from SAG Board and non-Board members.
 Members provide the articles plus images. SAG is currently using an easy basic Microsoft Word document template, but you can create the newsletter with the template of your choice. Teresa Brunson will always be available to assist and train. This job can be shared by more than one person
- Facebook Coordinator
- Instagram Coordinator
- Membership Coordinator
- Virtual Show Chairperson(s): Organize future online SAG
 website art shows. There are several members that can provide
 training on how to organize and plan the shows. These shows
 will be done by co-chairs (multiple people) who each decide how to divide duties:
 - Writing an article for the newsletter about the upcoming online art show that you are planning.
 - Keeping an organized listing of all art pieces, organizing a theme and dates of the show and things like that. For our first and current online website show we had a total of 53 art pieces so it is not a huge amount to keep a list of. We have several members that can assist and train you. Much of the organizing, writing of the prospectus, registration form etc. has already been done.
 - Making sure our SAG Facebook coordinator is announcing it on Facebook
- **Art Show Coordinators:** Not limited to a single chairperson and can be cochairs. Ideas for new venues are always encouraged.
 - Chair the Green Spring Art Show

- Chair the Franconia Art Show
- Chair the Goodwin House Art Show
- Chair Virtual/online shows

SAG will provide volunteers with: Speaker contract templates, Art Show Prospectus templates, Agenda templates, meeting minute examples, and many more tools and information to make it easy for any new Board member to step in. All of our experienced members, current and past, are available to assist and answer questions.

Spring Equinox Sketch Hike



March 20, 2022 3:30-6:00p.m. Lake Accotink Park

Join SAG Member Elaine Sevy, a certified Fairfax Master Naturalist, and learn about the Spring Equinox, long considered to be a time of new beginnings, renewal and growth. Enjoy a gentle hike on the first day of Spring searching for signs of the season. We will then find a place to settle and sketch while waiting for a full moon to rise.

Nature Journaling opens a door to a fascinating world of local natural wonders, stimulating your imagination and creativity.

A good basic Nature Journaling kit includes: 6x8" or 5x7"sketchbook (at least 100 lb. weight paper to handle light watercolor washes), HB drawing pencil, pencil sharpener, kneaded eraser, a waterproof ink pen such as a Pigma Micron 01 or 05, set of watercolor pencils (Derwent is a good brand), a small container for water (film canisters work great), Pentel Aquash Water Brush and Paper Towels. Or bring whatever materials you are comfortable using. I will have some tools on hand that you can try.

In addition to art supplies, definitely bring binoculars if you have them (I will bring a couple of extra pairs) and something to sit on. A chair is nice, but even a comfy towel will do. Also bring your cell phone and/or a camera for photo references.

Please NOTE: We will meet at the park's Marina. Parking is available in the Marina parking lot. It can fill up fast though, so you can also park in the large parking lot on the left as you drive into the park on Accotink Park Road and walk over to the Marina.

Directions to Lake Accotink Park (Don't use GPS devices):

Take Springfield/644W exit from I-95, which puts you on Old Keene Mill Road. At 3rd stoplight, turn right on Hanover Rd. Continue on Hanover (through residential section) to Highland Ave. Turn Left.Turn right on Accotink Park Rd. The park entrance is on the left (an industrial area is on the right). Accotink Park Rd. continues here. Take it until you reach the Marina parking lot at the end of the road. The large parking lot is on the left, before you reach the dam. This lot is below the railroad trestle.


