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From NASA to Creating Art

Charles Redmond spent from 1973 to 2002 with NASA, in Houston, JSC and later DC, HQ. As part of his duties and responsibilities with NASA he was often involved directly with artists or museums and various art and culture groups. Bob Schulman, NASA's Art Program Director at the time, and Charles once curated a special - gallery quality - exhibition of the different photos taken by Voyager 1 in its encounters with Jupiter and Saturn. These were on display at the National Academy of Sciences building on the Mall and there was an exhibition




booklet. On the Viking missions to Mars, 1 and 2, Charles was one of the public affairs staff who coordinated access and results with artists, philosophers, science fiction writers, clergy, et al.

As a kid, ages 8 to 12, he used colored pencils and rulers to do technical drawings of buildings, cars, refrigerators. At the same time he was carving balsa wood into buildings and using colored ink to distinguish them. From junior high through college he became more involved in both visual and 3D mobile art. He took art classes in high school and again in college. Also during those years he was beginning to develop his eye through photography and would often look through the lens and imagine what that view would look like as a drawing. He also experimented with oil paint on large (4'x4', 5'x5') canvasses. The works he did in college were often admired by friends and given to them.

Charles was drafted after college and went to Korea for his tour of duty. Korea Army facilities had been there long enough that there were several darkrooms and photo

clubs already existing so he dove into that past time and played with making posters for TV use. He got clever with collage using cut art and photography.



The time he was at JSC gave him an opportunity to try painting as well as photography. There were a lot of visual elements of Texas which are so profound that he spent almost 10 years there hiking and camping with his wife and son. He took over 10.000 35mm Ektachrome slides or Cibachrome negatives. Many of them he tried to recreate in acrylic, having tried this medium in addition to oils he had been using.

Charles continued with different themes and

approaches when he was transferred to HQ and moved to DC. He lived near an art store and began to experiment with pallet knives and other devices to spread paint beyond brushes. Some of the works use techniques he first applied to his artwork in Houston - where his wife wanted one for her office wall. He continued with what he imagined might be described as an approach to capture the



"feel" of a place with a minimal "landscape" approach presented as abstractly as he could also trying to keep in mind the photographic reference themes of - content, layout, color, contrast, and focus.

In moving to Seattle from DC, he discovered another art store, associated with a well-known oil, watercolor and ink company- Daniel Smith. They introduced acrylics which used microparticles which meant that one line of their acrylic paints, Duochrome, created two colors in one depending on which way you looked at it or which way the light was projected. They made about a dozen of these paints so he absolutely went to town using them. And at the same time he began embedding real objects in the acryllic paintings - real objects like parts of a computer or a hard drive or baubles he found on the ground (shiny pieces of glass).

When he worked at NASA in DC, he was always walking across the Mall over lunch or after work to drop in on the National Gallery of

Art and especially the East Wing. When he was in Houston working at JSC, his house was within 8 blocks of the Rothko Chapel, a place he would often go to find - yet again - something hidden in one of Rothko's giant wall paintings. He was continually experiencing art and has seen some amazing exhibitions at some of the galleries.

The crayon art certainly has its own history which Charles will explain as part of the Zoom presentation. This new art form is another in a long life of using art to explore color and form and to see what is fun and what isn't. Charles says he is an artist because it fulfills his desire to create, makes him smile, and gives him the chance to show others something colorful. His favorite art eras are the Impressionist period and the Modernist period, but he is drawn to visual creations - paintings, sculptures, mobiles, Bas Relief on buildings.

SAG Spring Juried Virtual Show May 7 - July 2, 2022

Artwork from your past 4 years



SAG Spring Virtual Show Prospectus

This show is open to all Guild members and will be shown exclusively on the Springfield Art Guild website. This show will be juried. Artwork will be selected by the Juror and prizes awarded. In addition to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards, other awards may be granted by the juror. Cash prizes to be awarded.

There is no theme for this show since our last show had a theme. However, we do want you to pick artwork from your work over the past 4 years. So it may be something you worked on during the pandemic if you were creative. And if not so creative or productive, you can pick from something finished a little older up to 4 years ago. All mediums and styles can be submitted. 3-D artists can submit more than one image for each entry. All artists submitting the maximum of 3 pieces will be guaranteed at least one is entered into the show. The Entry fee is \$10 each or 3 for \$25. Since this is a virtual show it will require 2 registration forms – one for the photos of your artwork you email and one for the payment registration to mail via postal service.

Our juror for this show is Stacy Slaten. Below is a little bit about our juror. She will be jurying our show online, so make sure your photos are of good quality in jpeg format. Our juror will pick all the artwork for this show and give out awards.

Juror: Stacy Slaten

Stacy Slaten is an Associate Professor of Drawing and Painting and at Northern Virginia Community College in Alexandria, Virginia. Her drawings are exhibited nationally across the country from galleries and museums such as Five Points Gallery, Torrington, CT; Impasto Art Gallery, Longmont, CO; Las Laguna Gallery, Laguna Beach, CA; Ellen Noel Art Museum, Odessa, TX to local places like Del Ray Artisans Gallery, Alexandria, VA and Vienna Arts Society, Vienna, VA. She earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Drawing and Painting, another in Jewelry Design and Metalsmithing, and one in Human Sciences at Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas, where she is from. She then earned a Master of Fine Arts in Painting from Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. Currently, she lives in Alexandria with her parrot and continues to investigate drawing as a primary expression. Please visit www.stacyslaten.com for further information about her work.

June 5, 2022 - Zoom Reception and Award Announcements staring at 1PM.

Submission Criteria:

- 1. Artwork may be something you painted during the pandemic, but does not have to have been created at that time. It must have been completed in the last 4 years. Any style or medium is welcome.
- 2. Only original 2-D and 3-D art, will be considered. Traditional photographs and digitally enhanced photographs are welcome. **Drafts, photocopies, offset prints, lithographs, or copies of already published art will not be permitted.**
- 3. We encourage all artwork submitted be for sale. You may include a single "Not for Sale" piece in order to help you submit the 3 art piece max to help guarantee you get at least one in the show.
- 4. If selected, your artwork will appear in the exhibition from May 7 to July 2, 2022.
- 5. If your artwork sells, it will be marked on the website as sold and you may proceed with making arrangements to deliver your artwork to the buyer, pay VA sales tax and pay a 20% commission fee to SAG
- 6. SAG members may submit up to 3 pieces of artwork. Only good quality photos of unframed art will be accepted. Any photos that do not meet this criteria will not be accepted. Submitting 3 pieces will guarantee that you get at least one in.
- 7. If you submit a diptych or triptych, it will count as one piece of artwork.
- 8. Artists selling their art will be responsible for collecting the money, collecting and paying the Virginia sales tax, and all shipping aspects of purchased artwork. SAG's website does not have e-commerce capability. People interested in purchasing art will be directed to a single SAG point of contact who will contact the individual artists. Commissions will be paid directly to the Springfield Art Guild no later than May 17 2021. Send your 20% commission check to Chris Jenkins at 5215 Pumphery Drive Fairfax, VA 22032.
- 9. Photographs of art must portray a clear and accurate view of what the piece looks like. Artwork previously shown at a SAG sponsored show may be submitted.
- 10. You must send a jpeg for each piece of art you submit that is named with your last name and the title of your art. The jpeg needs to be no smaller than 250KB and no larger than 1MB. Many of you may have to resize your photos. In the email in which you send your photos, please include your name, the title, medium, size unframed (and framed if it has a frame) and the price.
- 11. Make sure your membership is up to date.

The Art of Looking is a virtual program which provides presentations on many topics. There is a free registration requirement <u>Click here</u> to see the schedule of future "The Art of looking" programs. Each session lasts one hour and is completely interactive. National Gallery educators will facilitate the conversation to create an environment for shared learning. These conversations will encourage you to engage deeply with art, with others, and with the world around you as you hone skills in visual literacy and perspective-taking.

This program is free, open to the public, and is designed for everyone interested in talking about art. No art or art history background is required. Ages 18 and over.
