Works in Progress Critique

Every year we hold a “Works in Progress” critique and we are fortunate to have professional artist, Stacy Slaten, to facilitate our critique this year. This is not a judging of a final piece of artwork. This critique is meant to assist each artist in completing their artwork through helpful constructive comments. Many times while we are creating our “master pieces” we get stuck and are unsure how to complete it. We work and rework our artwork but still can’t get it the way we want. Critiques from fellow artists can be very helpful and offer a huge insight and learning tool. This year we are lucky to have professional artist, Stacy Slaten, to critique our unfinished artwork and help us get “unstuck”. Any SAG member who would like to participate can bring in **one** piece of unfinished artwork to be professionally critiqued. The September meeting is Wednesday September 14.



Stacy Slaten is an Associate Professor of Drawing and Painting and at Northern Virginia Community College in Alexandria, Virginia. Her drawings are exhibited nationally across the country from galleries and museums such as Five Points Gallery, Torrington, CT; Impasto Art Gallery, Longmont, CO; Las Laguna Gallery, Laguna Beach, CA; Ellen Noel Art Museum, Odessa, TX to local places like Del Ray Artisans Gallery, Alexandria, VA and Vienna Arts Society, Vienna, VA. She earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Drawing and Painting, another in Jewelry Design and Metalsmithing, and one in Human Sciences at Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas, where she is from. She then

SAG's COVID Precautions and Steps for Safety

The Board is excited to welcome back the SAG members to in-person meetings at Grace Church starting on September 14, 2022 after 2 years of alternative methods which we are grateful for as well as your patience and participation. Our first meeting is a critique which most of us are happy to receive help on a stuck, not quite finished painting.

That being said, we know that some members may be hesitant to come back to in person meetings. We have discussed at the last Board meeting what will be done to protect the Guild members as much as possible. Here are the things we are going to do and ask of you.

- 1 - Hand Sanitizer will be available to use. (You may use your own)
- 2 - Wearing masks is optional (We know not everyone can or is willing to wear one & this virus mutates frequently) Use your judgement.
- 3 - We will space the chairs further apart than pre-COVID. (feel free to move yours further apart)

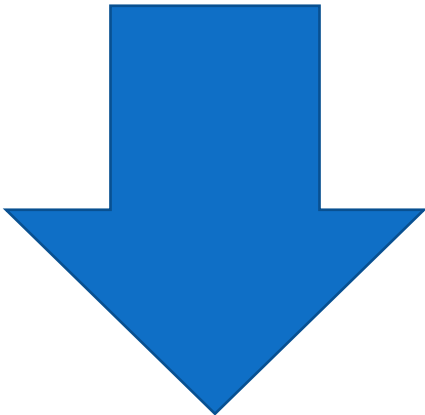
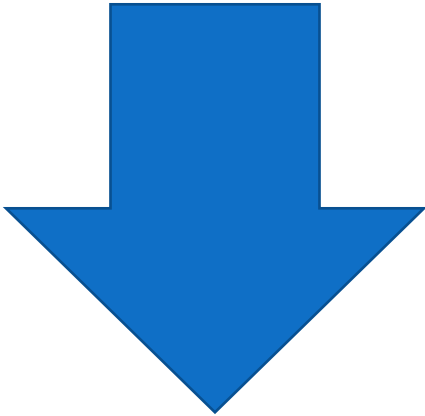

Long time SAG member, Cynthia Shoepel, introduced us to the online application, Jotform (jotform.com) for our previous Green Spring Gardens art show and it worked out so well we have decided to use it for future shows and other online needs. We just upgraded to the paid plan for the year. We found the application worked fantastic last year for the Green Spring Gardens show submissions.

Many of you might already be familiar with this application, since it's used by other arts organizations and art calls. It easily collects submissions for art shows and will help us save time and work by creating the spreadsheets and organizing the images.

We are planning to schedule a zoom meeting for members who want to learn more about Jotform and how to submit your art for the upcoming shows--virtual and in person. The Green Spring Gardens show is right around the corner.

No art can be left after 12:30. No early pickup. Artists **MUST** pick up during this date/time or arrange pickup by a friend. SAG and Green Springs will **NOT** be held responsible for any artwork left after the pickup deadline

Submission Criteria

1. Artwork must focus on **local** flora, fauna, or landscapes/structures in DC/MD/VA.
2. Artwork must be for sale.
3. SAG members may submit up to 3 pieces of original artwork no larger than 24" x 24" not previously entered in Green Springs' shows.
4. Art must be ready to hang, **original 2-D art**. Original photographs and digital art (see #1) are eligible.
 - a. Photocopies, giclee prints or any type of reproduction are not eligible
 - b. Saw tooth hangers, clips, wet canvases, damaged frames, soiled or poorly matted are not eligible
5. **Permission to reproduce** any submitted artwork by the Springfield Art Guild and Green Spring Gardens for publicity and archival purposes is automatically granted by the artist as a requisite for entering the show.
6. **30% commission** – Green Springs requires Artists making sales to submit a 30% commission to Green Spring Gardens Park at the close of the show. Virginia sales tax will be collected by Green Spring Gardens. All taxes, including sales taxes upon sale of artwork, are the responsibility of the artist. All sales will be made through Green Spring Gardens.
7. **Liability** - Springfield Art Guild and Green Spring Gardens will not be held liable for any loss or damage to artwork at any time. By submitting this application, the artist agrees to fully and finally release the Springfield Art Guild, its directors, officers, employees or volunteers and employees of Green Springs involved with the exhibit of any and all responsibility for any damage or loss to any artwork during the time of the exhibition, set up or take down. Be aware insurance policies in effect will not provide coverage for damage or loss due to fire, theft or burglary and vandalism. By submission, the artist agrees to assume all risk of damage to or loss of his/her own art from whatever cause. The artist can maintain their own insurance if they so choose.
8. **VOLUNTEERING: ALL artists** participating in this exhibit **are required to volunteer** for one of the tasks below to assist with the show. When you sign up on the Jotform, there is a link to the list of volunteer tasks/activities to sign up too.
 - **Check** at least **2-3 tasks/activities** to allow the committee to choose one of your selections
 - Artists will be notified of assignment prior to Installation date.
 - Number of Volunteers needed in each category are noted (*_)

I want to thank everyone who took the time to answer the survey through jot.form about the Virtual shows. Your input is invaluable. The Virtual show committee has already met and we have made decisions based on your info. This SAG year of 2022-2023, the Guild will be having 2 Virtual shows. I will be giving some information here so that you are informed of what will be coming.

We will be having a **Fall Virtual Artist's Choice show**. The Show dates will be November 5, 2022 through January 28, 2023. The prospectus will be coming out in September and the show will be open for entries/submissions starting September 17, 2022. All of this info will be in the calendar, on the prospectus and mentioned at the meetings. This show will also include voting for a People's Choice award which will be given to the winner at the December Holiday party.

The second Virtual show will be a **Spring Juried Virtual show**. It will also be a theme show. The theme for this show is "My Perspective: How I See the World". A fleshed out description will be given at a later date. There will be awards given out at the Reception (Virtual) as happened this past Spring. The dates for this show are April 22, 2023 through July 1, 2023. The starting date for entries/submissions will be February 18, 2023.

The show committee is willing to have another "how to take photos of your artwork" session for those who need help in making your photos ready to present to a juror. We will also be accepting NFS (Not For Sale) pieces you may wish to submit this year. However artwork previously shown in any SAG Virtual Art show on the SAG website, will not be accepted. Please keep track of what has been accepted to which show. We would rather not have to decline your work because it has been seen on the website before.

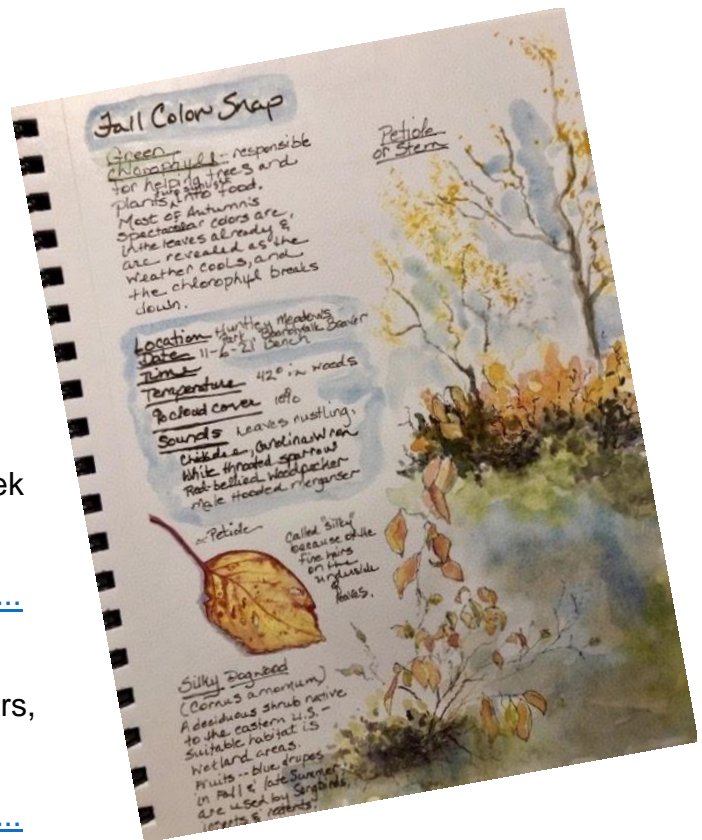

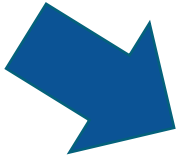
