Rachel Collins NWS WATERCOLOR PAINTER

Rachel Collins considers herself a representational painter of natural and man-made abstract form. Although she grew up in a home in New York State where her mother taught oil painting, design and composition, she did not pursue art on her own until she reached her late thirties.

By then she had graduated from Middlebury College, received a master's degree in library science from the University of Wisconsin, and worked for thirteen years as librarian, archivist and museum curator at the Baha'i World Centre in Haifa, Israel.

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In many ways she feels that watercolor chose her, rather than vice versa. Her love for a very close-in view of nature subjects derives in part from the microscope work she did at the museum.

While in Haifa she took her first watercolor class. She and her family returned to the United States in 1990 and settled in Alexandria, VA.

The move to the Washington DC area was instrumental in her development as an artist. An interest in natural science illustration led her to an internship doing pen and ink drawings of parts of micro-moths in the Department of Entomology at the Museum of Natural History. But eventually watercolor as fine art became her primary medium, especially once she was asked to teach.



The fascination with nature subjects has continued, but subject matter in her paintings has broadened to include a growing amount of landscape work and a continuing series of music-related paintings.

Rachel recently completed 20 years as an artist maintaining a studio in the Torpedo Factory Art Center.

Although the ending of her studio lease in the Factory was not of her choice, she is now grateful for the freedom that a home studio offers her. It may be small, but it is

sufficient!



SAG's COVID Precautions and Steps for Safety

Submission Criteria

- Subject Matter Artwork must focus on any flora, fauna, or local landscapes and historical buildings in DC/MD/VA.
- Artwork must be for sale.
- Entry Criteria SAG members can submit up to three (3) original artworks
 - a. no larger than 36"x36"
 - b. have never been shown at any Green Spring Gardens SAG shows previously
 - c. All artwork must be your own creation, not a copy or derivative of someone else's work. You cannot use a photograph as a reference unless it is your personal photo or you have the owner's permission for use; you cannot use other artists' artwork nor any image derived from a magazine, newspaper, or social media (Instagram, Facebook, websites etc.) for your submission(s).
- Eligible Submissions Artwork must be original 2-D pieces, ready to hang. Original photographs and digital art (see #1) are eligible.
 - a. NOT eligible: Photocopies, giclee prints or any type of reproduction
 - **b. NOT eligible:** Saw tooth hangers, clips, wet canvases, damaged frames, torn backings, soiled or poorly matted
- Permission to reproduce submitted artwork by the Springfield Art Guild and Green Spring Gardens for publicity and archival purposes is automatically granted by the artist as a requisite for entering the show.
- 30% commission Green Springs requires Artists making sales to submit a 30% commission to Green Spring Gardens Park at the close of the show. Virginia sales tax will be collected by



Green Spring Gardens. Paying all taxes, including sales taxes upon sale of artwork, are the responsibility of the artist. All sales will be made through Green Spring Gardens.

- Liability The Springfield Art Guild and Green Spring Gardens are not liable for any loss or damage to artwork at any time. By submitting your application/entries, you release them, their staff and all volunteers from any responsibility for any damage or loss to your artwork during the exhibition, set up, or take down. Be aware insurance policies in effect will not provide coverage for damage or loss due to fire, theft or burglary and vandalism. By submission, the artist agrees to assume all risk of damage to or loss of his/her own art from whatever cause. Artists may obtain their own insurance.
- **VOLUNTEERING All participating artists MUST volunteer** for several tasks from the list provided on the online registration JotForm to help with the show

Watercolor Painting Workshop

(Aspen Trees in Winter)

This class is designed for students (beginner to intermediate) who want to explore the unique principles of watercolor: transparency, speed, & spontaneity. Workshop will emphasize and demonstrate brush work, color mixing, wash techniques, value patterns, design layout, and composition. Students will create an 8"x10" painting. All art supplies will be provided by instructor but students must bring a 16"x20" hard board or foam board to use as a painting support surface. Must be Age 16+ and class is limited to 8 students.



This show is open to all Guild members and will be exclusively shown on the Springfield Art Guild website. This is an Artist's Choice show. It can be in any medium, style, genre, etc. you wish. Your submitted artwork can be something you just completed or something you did a long time ago. There are no restrictions to when you completed your artwork. Your artwork cannot have been previously shown in any SAG Virtual show on the website before. Requirements are listed below.

A People's Choice award will be given for this show in which the public will be able to vote for the favorite piece. A flyer will be sent out with a link to jotform for voting that you can send to friends and family. There will be approximately 3 weeks to vote. The winner will be announced after the voting period has ended and the award will be handed out at the November monthly meeting. There will not be a reception for this show.

- 1. Artwork submitted may be something you painted recently, but can be artwork you've had awhile and hasn't sold. Artwork must fit the theme of this show which is Artist's Choice. Any style, medium, genre, etc. is welcome.
- 2. Only original 2-D and 3-D art, will be considered. Traditional photographs and digitally en hanced photographs are welcome. Drafts, photocopies, offset prints, lithographs, or copies of already published art will not be permitted.
- 3. All artwork can be for sale, but NFS will also be accepted.
- 4. If selected, your artwork will appear in the exhibition from September 30 to December 2, 2023.
- 5. If your artwork sells, it will be marked on the website as sold and you may proceed with making arrangements to deliver your artwork to the buyer and pay VA sales tax. You will also need to pay a 10% commission fee from your sale payable to SAG. These fees will be used later for awards in our Spring Juried Virtual show, which will be the 2nd of two virtual shows on the SAG website this year.
- 6. SAG members may submit up to 3 pieces of artwork. Only good quality photos taken without the frame will be accepted. Please make sure you crop your photos well, make sure no shine appears and that the photos are in focus. Any photos that do not meet these criteria will not be accepted.
- 7. If you submit a diptych or triptych, it will count as one piece of artwork.
- 8. Artists selling their art will be responsible for collecting the money, collecting and paying the Virginia sales tax, and all shipping aspects of purchased artwork. SAG's website does not have e-commerce capability. People interested in purchasing art will be directed to a single SAG point of contact who will then contact the individual artists. Commissions will be paid directly to the Springfield Art Guild no later than December 15, 2023. Send your 10% commission check to the SAG Treasurer, Marshal Carolus at 4476 Raleigh Ave. Apt 102 Alexandria, VA 22304. Please put Attn: SAG on the envelope and on the check please make a note that this commission is from your
- 9. Photographs of art must portray a clear and accurate view of what the piece looks like. Artwork previously shown at a SAG sponsored Virtual show may not be submitted.
