### **Şermin Ciddi TRADITIONAL OTTOMAN ARTIST** THE PRACTICE OF TRADITIONAL OTTOMAN ART IN CONTEMPORARY TIMES WITH CONTEMPORARY THEMES

Sermin Ciddi is a contemporary Ottoman miniature (minyatÜr) artist from Istanbul, Turkey.

She is an award-winning artist and teacher, who explores subjects of cityscapes, monuments and nature, in a comparable way to how an Ottoman chronicler would attempt to portray our environment today. Motivated by the word "esperanto", she is committed to preserving the legacy of memories.






Typically, she paints places she has lived in, visited and already reside in. She portrays cities and nature as she sees them today, and the way she wants to perceive them, as well as bring into focus the parts that she would like the observer to see, and hopefully feel.

The miniature painting style helps Sermin embrace contemporary techniques while allowing her to remain loyal to her Turkish cultural roots. Her artwork gives a voice to what she can't convey to her audiences through words: spaces, hope and time that thrive inside and exist around us. Sometimes, it's not possible to reach these spaces, which are presented through only perspectives. Regardless; her goal has always been to make her work relatable to individuals across the globe, in the hope of building cultural bridges that overcome our divisions and fears. Her work stands for hope across domains of adversity.








Miniature painting (minyatür) and the art of Illumination (tezhip) represent highly specialized fields of classical Ottoman Turkish fine arts. As forms of art and decorating, they peaked during the seventeenth century within the Ottoman Empire, but they were also shared by other regional civilizations, most notably Persia. Experiencing a decline in the face of modern art in the early twentieth century, a resurgence of this art form began again in the early 1980s. Sermin teaches and paints these traditional art forms, with a distinctly contemporary emphasis. She is becoming recognized within Turkey as a foremost practitioner and exhibitionist.



Hi! I'm Carol Lynne Barto. I was raised in Massachusetts. I am a retired-Army spouse, and mom of two grown children. Within my husband's 20 year career, we've moved about thirteen times. Four years out of that twenty, were spent in Beijing, China as an attaché family. I met other attaché spouses from all over the world, and enjoyed learning about and seeing their unique intelligence, beauty, clothing, languages, and customs. In every new region, I would go on walks with my little people and enjoy the unique nature of a place, the people, and cultures.





Over the years, my artistic education was sporadic, but very surprising to me, I seemed to make big leaps creatively in the empty spaces between learning. In China, I took portraiture chalk pastel classes with an amazing artist, Kathy Hirsh. Learning from her helped me take the leap and go back to school once we returned to the states. 


