Sharon Robinson

Mixed Media Artist

Sharon is a mixed media artist specializing in abstract collage and assemblage, currently residing in the Washington, DC area. Raised in New Jersey, her educational, professional and personal pursuits have led to her residing in various locations on the east and west coast since graduating from high school. The social justice movements of the 60's and 70's and personal experiences in the Boston area as an undergraduate at Tufts University greatly influenced her desire to craft a career that combined addressing both the social and physical environments in urban areas, leading to an undergraduate degree in urban studies and master's degree in urban design and community development from MIT.







Upon graduation from MIT, she worked in the urban transit and planning field for 20 years in Los Angeles and Portland, OR., managing property acquisition, interagency agreements, environmental mitigation and station area planning and development programs, among other responsibilities.

Since 1999 she has been a full-time artist, muralist, teacher, and arts program contractor. She has had numerous exhibitions in the DC region, as well as other east and west coast cities. Sharon teaches mixed media and collage classes for the Smithsonian Associates Studio Arts Program, The Art League School (Torpedo Factory) in Alexandria, VA, and Pyramid Atlantic Art Center in Hyattsville, MD, as well as other regional venues. Her community activities include serving on the national Board of Directors of SCRAP, a network of non-profit creative re-use centers, a board member of Pyramid Atlantic Art Center, and as an appointee to the Arts Commission of the City of Mt. Rainier., MD.

Like many artists, Sharon began pursuing creative endeavors as a child, and enjoyed drawing, making doll furniture and eventually sewing, which she learned from her mother. Upon reaching high school, she took art classes and was exposed to watercolor painting and jewelry making, sparking an even greater interest in the arts. While the demands of school, work and eventually family left little time to actively pursue art for many years, a change of circumstance allowed her to become active in the Watercolor Society of Oregon and establish a grounding in the arts community in the Pacific Northwest. The WSO presented numerous opportunities for workshops and exposure to the expertise of enormously talented local artists as well as nationally recognized artists that juried local shows. This learning environment launched her interest in water media and eventually collage and mixed media as extensions of painting. More recently, she has learned papermaking and begun to experiment with sculptural forms with paper and other materials.

Her love of mixed media is spurred by the limitless possibilities of combining materials in two- and three-dimensional forms that provide the simple joy of creating work that expresses elements of life that connect human beings and their environment. A lover of history, she is most drawn to themes addressing cultural integration, the long history of human migrations over time and space, and how we carry both the physical and social markers of those movements across the planet. While she often constructs purely abstract compositions focusing on color, pattern, and texture, most of her work incorporates some representational elements, as a way for the viewer to identify and engage with the piece. These may include images, cultural motifs, symbols, text, and related representations of social identity. The process of layering materials both literally and figuratively, allows for the construction of a visual interpretation of the richness of the fabric of life. The hope is that the viewer will pause and ponder their own perspectives on their place in the world and how they fit into the latest version of millennia of mixing, matching, migrating, and mingling.

Green Spring Gardens' annual art show is a show with monetary awards for 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and the SAG Founders Award. A certificate will be given for the Honorable Mention and People's Choice Award.

Garden Dreams is open to all current 2025 Springfield Art Guild members. All artists must register and volunteer by **Wednesday, April 25, 2025** by Midnight. The 30% commission on all sales will benefit the Friends of Green Spring Gardens Park (FROGS). Our judge this year will be Joey Manlapaz, https://www.joeymanlapaz.com/

- Participating artists must volunteer to assist with the show. The list of volunteer tasks/activities to sign up for is located on this online registration form.
- SAG members may submit up to three (3) 2-dimensional pieces of original artwork not previously entered in a Green Springs' show. Artwork can be any medium. Original photographs and digital art are eligible. The size limit is 36 by 36 inches.
- Art should be ready to hang or display with wire and screw eyes, framed, matted, or with edges finished. We cannot show work that is not ready for exhibition.
 Not eligible: saw tooth hangers, clips, wet canvases, damaged frames, torn backings, soiled or poorly matted artwork.

Entry Details

- Open to all currently paid Springfield Art Guild members.
- The subject of the artwork must be based on regional (DC/MD/VA) horticultural or natural themes with the exception of no seascapes, people portraits or pet portraits (unless otherwise approved).
- All artwork must be for sale. We will not accept pieces marked "NFS". All works will be available for purchase, at the price which is set by the artist for each piece. Green Spring Gardens reserves the right to decline the inclusion of any artwork.
- Artists may submit up to three (3) 2-D pieces of original artwork, no larger than 36" x 36".
- Artwork must not have been shown at any Green Spring Gardens SAG shows previously.
- Each entry must be original work created by the artist. It may not be a copy, likeness or derivative of another's artistic creation from any source. This includes any work done in a workshop, as a class assignment, or from an instructor's demo. Artwork must be your own thought, idea, composition and image. It cannot be a direct copy of a photograph, painting, or image, including images from written publications (newspaper, magazine) and social media (Instagram, Facebook, websites, etc.), unless you have the artist's expressed permission or the image is copyright free.
 - Not eligible: photocopies, giclee prints or any type of reproduction.
- Deadline for online submission of your art is April 25, 2025 by midnight.
- The entry fee is \$10 for each piece or \$25 for 3 pieces. Must be paid by check.
- Entry fees are due on submission and are non-refundable. Make checks payable to Springfield Art Guild (SAG) and mail to: Pat Hafkemeyer, SAG GSG Show, and 5926 Burnside Landing Dr. Burke, VA 22015.





- You must provide one photo for each entry (artwork only no mat or frame in photo).
 Acceptable file types are: jpg, jpeg; up to 1MB in file size.
- Smart phone photos are acceptable. You must name your files as follows:
 "YourLastName_FirstName_Title", (example: smith_john_redbarn.jpg).
 Final acceptance for this exhibit will be at the curators' discretion upon physically viewing accepted artwork at Artwork Receiving.

Accepted Artist Requirements

- Green Spring Gardens will collect all sales in which the customer uses cash or check.
 They do not handle any credit card or other types of transactions for the art shows. It is
 up to the individual artist to handle transactions other than cash/check with the customer.
 If your artwork sells you will get a call with the customer's name and contact information.
 It will be up to you to contact the customer to arrange payment via Square, Venmo,
 PayPal, etc.
- Virginia sales tax will be included on the price tag label with each artwork. Paying all sales taxes to the State is the responsibility of the artist.
- Green Springs requires artists making sales to submit a 30% commission payment to Green Spring Gardens Park at the close of the show.
- Please provide your preferred contact method -- either an email address or phone number -- in the registration form below.
- Springfield Art Guild and Green Spring Gardens <u>are not liable</u> for any loss or damage to artwork at any time. By submitting your application/entries, you release them, their staff and all volunteers from any responsibility for any damage or loss to your artwork during the exhibition, set up, or take down. Be aware insurance policies in effect will not provide coverage for damage or loss due to fire, theft or burglary and vandalism. By submission, the artist agrees to assume all risk of damage to or loss of his/her own art from whatever cause. Artists may obtain their own insurance.
- Permission to reproduce submitted artwork by the Springfield Art Guild and Green Spring Gardens for publicity and archival purposes is automatically granted by the artist as a requisite for entering the show. - All artists participating in this exhibit are required to volunteer to assist with the show.
 Volunteers are needed for receiving artwork, hanging of the show, reception, and artwork pick up among other jobs.
- Unsold artwork pickup is on **Saturday**, **June 28**, **2025 from 11AM to 12:30PM**. No early pickup. Springfield Art Guild and Green Spring Gardens cannot be held responsible for any artwork left after pickup deadline. There is no storage available. All artwork must be picked up by 12:30pm.


